### Purpose of Community Service Diploma Endorsement

- Act 295 (Regular Session 2012) authorized awarding a Community Service Diploma Endorsement beginning with freshmen entering school year 2013-2014.
- Recognize high school students who perform community service.
- Engage students in their communities.
- Provide a process to apply student learning in a social setting.
- Provide opportunities for students to explore their interests, passions, and potential career aspirations in an engaged, hands-on environment.



# Community Service is Service Learning

- For the purposes of this endorsement, it is important to distinguish between volunteering/service and donating/fundraising, two separate distinct activities.
- The Community Service Diploma Endorsement recognizes students who engage in service learning, who commit time and interact with the community to support and encourage.

### Community Service Diploma Endorsement Requirements

Minimum Yearly Requirements*	
9 <sup>th</sup> Grade	10
10 <sup>th</sup> Grade	20
11 <sup>th</sup> Grade	25
12 <sup>th</sup> Grade	25

- Meets the minimum requirements for each year, and
- Completes a total of 80 community service hours by graduation

<sup>\*</sup>NOTE: A student who (1) transfers into a participating LEA after the 9th grade or (2) graduates early may receive a community service endorsement if that student:



- 1. Determine your school/district plan for Community Service Diploma Endorsement.
- 2. Review types of <u>Community Service Categories</u>
- 3. Join school and/or community service clubs to plan and conduct service projects (Note: If your school does not have a service club, contact local non-profits about planned service projects. See description of community service categories for suggestions.)
- 4. Select and plan carefully for community service events that do not conflict with school and district calendars (e.g., state tests, required school activities, holidays).
- 5. Use the <u>Community Service Diploma Endorsement Student Documentation</u>
  <u>Form</u> to submit student participation to school/district Community Service
  contact for inclusion on Community Service Diploma Endorsement
  <u>District/School Tracking Form</u>
