

## **Social Studies Whole-Class Instructional Strategy:**

# **Causation**

#### The Basics

**What**? A protocol to help students consider historical events and developments within their own context (the situation within which something exists or happens).

When? At the start of a new unit or topic, before doing any in-depth primary source analysis.

**Why**? To ensure students understand the context within which events unfolded, rather than viewing events in isolation, and can assess the significance of specific events and developments.

## **How to Implement**

Select an event, process, person, or source that students have been learning about, or are preparing to learn about. Either as a class, in groups, or individually have students:

- 1. List possible causes.
- 2. Then, categorize the causes as either short-term, intermediate-term, or long-term and place them in the appropriate sections on the <u>graphic organizer</u>.
- 3. After that, use the graphic organizer key to help you label the causes: role, significance, and type.
- 4. In the role section
  - a. Students will identify the triggering event (for example the straw that broke the camel's back)
  - b. Next, they will identify the contributing causes
  - c. Finally, students will identify the underlying causes
- 5. Students will identify the cause:
  - a. Economic
  - b. Cultural
  - c. Political
  - d. Technological
  - e. Environmental
  - f. Ideas/Beliefs
- 6. (optional) The teacher can ask students to create a causal map and use their answers here to help construct that causal representation.
