Unit 1 Topic 1 - Purpose and Types of Government

Many roles in the U.S. Government have counterparts worldwide: for example, many countries have congresses that make laws and high courts that decide important legal matters. What makes the U.S. Government unique is not its individual parts but the way they fit together. To understand this, this topic will look at the history of democratic government.
