


Some of the earliest humans, who lived in Africa around 160,000 years ago, used stone arrowheads for hunting.




Between sixty thousand and ninety thousand years ago, humans began migrating out of Africa, first into Asia and then into Australia and Europe.

CHAPTER 2: The Agricultural Revolution


Around 10,000 BCE, nomadic hunter-gatherers began to settle in groups and grow their own food.

CHAPTER 2: The Agricultural Revolution




The Neolithic or Agricultural Revolution occurred from about 10,000 BCE to 3,000 BCE.


CHAPTER 3: The Characteristics of Civilization
