


The Western Roman Empire fell in 476 CE.




In 800 CE, Charlemagne was crowned emperor of the Romans.


Around 1000–1300 CE, towns grew in Europe.




After Muhammad's death in 632 CE, Islam spread to the borders of India and China in the east, through northern Africa, and into Spain.
