Standards Review Nominator Webinar



BESE Directives

In March, BESE called on the Department to present a plan to review Louisiana's English and math content standards. The plan continues the state's tradition of professional standards reviews, maintaining a Louisiana set of standards to continue on the path begun more than four years ago to raise student expectations and outcomes.

BESE required the Department commence the next scheduled review of state academic content standards in English language arts and mathematics, as required in Bulletin 741, §2301(C).

Louisiana Standards


The Department proposes a standards review process led by professional Louisiana educators that results in the best Louisiana standards for students.

Louisiana is free to use the standards that best prepare students and meet state laws. Louisiana's state laws require that standards be rigorous and prepare students for college and the workplace, as determined by educators, experts, and business and industry leaders. Nothing prevents Louisiana from making any adjustments to current state content standards deemed appropriate, and there are no limitations on the extent to which the standards are adjusted to meet local needs and priorities.

The following principles will guide this local review:

- 1. Consistency: The standards review will be consistent with the legally required process and with past Louisiana standards reviews.
- **2. Focus on the standards:** The review process will focus on the substance of the actual standards themselves.
- **3. Improve what exists today rather than start from scratch:** The review process will improve current standards based on local, expert input and results, rather than requiring of teachers another five years of work to re-do classroom plans.
- **4. Public input:** The review process will include opportunities for the public to weigh in on every standard. In addition, all meetings will be open to the public.

- Current Louisiana educator or, if not a current educator, significant past experience addressing the learning needs of Louisiana children
- Can meet all time commitments (see slide 8)
- Has agreed to the nomination

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Nominee Commitments

All nominees must be able to meet the following time commitments:

Content-subcommittee participation only

- In-person meeting attendance: 4 full days during the 2015-2016 school year; days as needed during the fall of the 2016-2017 school year (not to exceed two full days)
- Independent work: 2 hours per month from November 2015 to May 2016
- **Group virtual work:** Virtual meeting time to review and discuss updates as needed, not to exceed to 2 hours per month

Standards committee (steering committee)

- In-person meeting attendance: 4 full days during the 15-16 school year; 2 full days during the fall of the 16-17 school year
- Independent work: 2 hours per month from November 2015 to November 2016

A small number of nominees (12) will participate in both committees. Those nominees will have a significant time commitment.

Logistics - Committee Confirmation

After the Department receives nominations, Department staff will propose a committee list. While it is likely that not every single LEA will be represented, the Department will strive for regional and LEA diversity.

The Department will inform nominating organizations and candidates both that the individual is being nominated. This list will be posted May 25, contingent on candidates accepting their nomination. BESE will vote on all nominees June 17.

The Department will use the following criteria to build diverse committees from nominating lists:

- Each grade level K-12 in math and ELA represented
- Experts include early childhood, reading, mathematics, psychology, special education
- Representatives are diverse in gender, ethnicity and regional representation

Logistics – Costs

The Department will pay the following expenses:

- Mileage for anyone whose regular duties do not otherwise bring them to Baton Rouge (i.e. educators, parents)
- Lunch will be provided for all participants for day long meetings
- Meetings will not extend beyond a full day, thus overnight stays will not be necessary
