
## The 1 Minute Writing Context Checklist

The student used a remnant book to select a topic for writing. He selected Mickey Mouse which was added after a recent family vacation to Disney World.




The student uses an 8 location communication device, an alphabet flip chart and a Step-by-Step Communicator for selecting letters.





This is the writing sample that the student produced. Questioning confirmed that "W" was for "wow" meaning that Disney World was lots of fun.



The 1-Minute Writing Context Checklist is used to describe the writing lesson. Using the checklist multiple times, across a variety of writing experiences and across time can help assess progress and identify what supports are most effective for the student.
