## **Annual Process for Interests and Opportunities**

#### **Spring-Summer 2023**

LDOE releases menu and guidance on the list of indicators and the data to be used in scoring.



LDOE releases a survey to all schools for them to select their domains and indicators for that accountability year.



LDOE provides school systems with a validation report of the indicators their schools selected.



#### Fall 2024

LDOE releases I&O Index results to public as part of SPS and annual report cards.



#### **Spring-Summer 2024**

LDOE reviews documentation and produces final results roster for school systems.



#### Spring 2024

As a part of the data review process, school systems upload documentation substantiating indicator results based on data not collected by LDOE.

# The Menu-based Approach

Continuing in the 2023-2024 school year, the LDOE will use a "menu-based" approach for the Interests & Opportunities Index.


The LDOE annually publishes a list of **indicators** associated with each domain.

- **Domains** serve as broad groupings of offerings related to students' interests (in BESE policy).
- **Indicators** are the specific measures that can capture the extent to which a school is advancing students' interests and opportunities.

# Changes from the 2022-2023 Menu to the 2023-2024 Menu

- TA1 School offers arts courses taught by arts teachers certified in their area of instruction
  - Removed from the 2023-2024 Menu
  - All indicator reference numbers in The Arts have shifted up one in the 2023-2024
     Menu
- S4 School has adopted a high-quality science curriculum
  - Updated scoring structure:
    - 100% schoolwide HQIM adoption
    - 50% only partial HQIM adoption in certain grades/classes
- S5 School participates in an interscholastic STEM competition
  - Updated to the S6 Indicator in the 2023-2024 Menu



# Changes from the 2022-2023 Menu to the 2023-2024 Menu

- S6 School offers a dedicated club or student organization associated with a national or international organization focused on STEM
  - Updated to S7 Indicator in the 2023-2024 Menu
- S7 School offers programming over an extended period of time sponsored by external STEM partners as part of the state's LaSTEM initiative or other programming offered through national or regional experts
  - Updated to S5 Indicator in the 2023-2024 Menu
  - Now offered as a data-based indicator
- Course code lists for each domain were updated. Share the newest menu with Data Managers to ensure proper reporting.





## **Indicator Selection Process**

Schools select their indicators via Jotform and have their selections validated by school systems. Once they are selected and validated, they cannot be changed.

Four indicators will be selected on an annual basis per school. Selections must include:

- Total of 4 different indicators
- Represent 2 domains
- Minimum of 3 are data-based
- Represent all of the grade levels you serve

Not selecting indicators that meet these requirements will result in a 0 for the indicator.





## **Indicator Selection Process**

Step 1	<ul> <li>The Department opens the Jotform for indicator selection by school.</li> <li>Each school leader (contact information is pulled from Sponsor Site) receives a letter with their unique submission code and the link to access the Jotform</li> <li>Each school system Accountability Contact receives a letter with directions and the unique submission code for all schools in their system</li> <li>If a school leader does not receive their information, the school system Accountability Contact should share it with them.</li> </ul>
Step 2	Schools select their indicators through the Jotform
Step 3	School system superintendents (or their designees) validate selections



## Requirements

#### Annually all schools must:

- 1. Select four indicators
- 2. Submit their selections through Jotform
- 3. Receive superintendent validation for selections
- 4. Submit their annual data as a part of the existing collection process **and** verify that the data submitted is correct
- 5. Submit any necessary documentation as a part of the data collection process in Louisiana Data Review (LDR), if applicable





## **Data vs Documentation Based Indicators**

# **Interests and Opportunities: Data Sources**

Scoring for data based indicators is dependent on the following data sources. Inaccurate data could lead to an inaccurate score. Collections will not be reopened or delayed for inaccurate Interests and Opportunities data submissions.

- 1. CLASS Snapshot
- 2. Super App Submissions
- 3. Student Transcript System
- 4. Ad Hoc Collections
  - a. World Languages team collections for World Languages programs
  - b. Annual Alternative Site application
  - c. Annual diploma endorsement submissions

It is critical that all data managers work with accountability contacts to ensure that data is submitted correctly and on time.



# Unique Access Codes and Communication

- What is a unique access code?
  - A unique access code is the code your school uses to access and complete the jotform.
- Where do I enter my unique access code?
   Principals enter their school's unique code here.
- What if I didn't receive a unique access code?

  Your code is in the letter sent on 8/28. If you still need assistance, email accountability@la.gov.
- Can I share unique access codes to my schools (if I am a district accountability contact)?

Yes, you may share with school Principals.
