



Continuous Learning Task Force

During the 2020 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature, Senate Concurrent Resolution 63 was enrolled to create a continuous learning task force to assist the state Department of Education in developing guidance for Louisiana educators to meet the immediate need of supporting learning outside of our normal practices.


The Continuous Learning Task Force will create recommendations to LDOE on long term continuous learning improvements. During these meetings, task force members will understand the supports and guidance in place since the onset of COVID-19 in Louisiana's schools, the successes in implementing continuous learning plans, and the areas for refinement needed for the future.



What is Continuous Learning?


Continuous learning is provided in school systems though standards-aligned instruction using high-quality curriculum during modified operations which includes:

- · System level and school reopening plans,
- Technology access,
- · Strategic communications plans,
- · Versatile delivery methods,
- · Adaptive staffing models, and
- · Flexible calendars and schedules.




Meeting Procedures

Committee meetings: Meetings will be advertised, open to the public, and held pursuant to the Louisiana Open Meetings Law.

Committee leadership: The committee will be facilitated by the elected chairperson.


Voting and voting proxies: Other recent education advisory bodies have required appointed members to be present in order to vote. Proxies have been permitted to attend and participate in discussion but have not been allowed to not vote. They have also reserved votes for final recommendations and reports, rather than voting on many individual topics and subtopics in order to support the work of the group to progress. The chair, with input from this commission, will determine how best to address these considerations.



Meeting Procedures

Public comment at meetings: Public comment will be received during each meeting and prior to any votes or at the end of each meeting if no vote is taken. Members of the public may also submit written comments for the record. Public comments shall be limited to three (3) minutes.

Content of public comment: All public comment must relate to the agenda item under consideration.





Strong Start


In order to ensure a strong start for every student and for school systems to have a continuous education plan, LDOE released the Strong Start 2020 plan to support school systems in planning for and funding priorities aligned to their current, coherent school system plan.



Early Childhood Supports



Instructional Supports

- The Louisiana legislature allocated \$8 million to the LDOE for distance learning devices. LDOE purchased **23,118 Chromebooks** for **school systems across the state for schools serving grades K-8.**






Funding Supports: Believe!


Louisiana received, in total, more than \$1 billion via the Child Care and Development Block Grant distribution formula for states. The Department developed *Believe!* planning guidance to support community networks in accessing funding opportunities in these four strategies:

- Strategy 1: Child care is stabilized immediately, with a focus on providers and the early childhood workforce.
- Strategy 2: Communities expand child care supply and increase access to opportunities for high-quality early childhood care and education this year.
- Strategy 3: Teachers are prepared to lead classrooms and provide high-quality interactions for children every day.
- Strategy 4: Families with young children who experienced unfinished learning this year are given opportunities and support.

Funding Supports: Achieve!

The Department developed *Achieve!* planning guidance to support school systems as they begin planning for the development of *Achieve!* budgets using ESSER II and ESSER III formula funds.

There are new, updated, and previously released high-impact initiatives aligned to each priority and corresponding focus areas.



Funding Supports: GEER

Through the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund, all public and private schools and students will be provided free access to an online Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Purpose Prep content library and curriculum.

CRRSA dollars provided through the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund to K-12 systems will support the following initiatives.


Student Stats

- 99% of childcare centers are open.
- 71 % of pre-k-12 students are in-person.
- 9% of pre-k-12 students are hybrid.
- 20% of pre-k-12 students are virtual

• 2% of students in Louisiana tested positive for COVID-19.

National Reopening Leaders

- American Enterprise Institute's <u>Return to Learn Tracker</u> ranked Louisiana No. 7 in the nation for the highest number of students participating in face-to-face learning as of March 15, 2021.
- Louisiana's school reopening plan was ranked as the **eighth most aggressive in the nation** on the tracker prior to March 15.
- LDOE's Accelerate strategy and Summer Learning Program guidance are national models.
- Harvard University's <u>Opportunity Insights</u> data shows Louisiana students led nation for math gains from May 2020 to March 2021.




Outreach Efforts

- Survey and focus groups on virtual lessons learned
- 60+ listening sessions (students, families, educators, leaders, community, business)
- Numerous reopening webinars w/ 800+ school and system leaders
- Monthly virtual roundtables with school system leaders and chief academic officers
- New Office of School System Relations
- Bi-weekly virtual town halls with Children's Hospital New Orleans for educators, families
- 10,500+ emails to account designated for school reopening
- Weekly office hours
- Statewide working groups



Areas for Improvement

- Access and training for technology and broadband required for successful virtual learning for teachers and families
- Communication structures and resources to support families
- Student engagement (absenteeism/truancy)
- Consistent, high quality instruction across state during continuous learning
- System and school level emergency planning and preparedness structures in various situations
- Staffing and scheduling models and supports
- Supports for Els and SWD



Key Recommendation Areas

Aligned with the focus of this task force and generated from feedback across the state, there are four key recommendation areas for continuous learning improvements.

- Family Engagement and Support,
- Instructional Quality,
- System and School Planning, and
- Technology.




Working Groups
