

A chart at the bottom of the report outlines what each of the achievement levels means in terms of how well your child met the expectations for that grade and subject. **The score ranges change slightly across grade levels and subjects.** 



Performance is also broken down into reporting categories and/or subcategories, as shown in the example below.

In each reporting category and subcategory, your child is provided a rating of one to three stars, with a description of performance in the specific area and the support needed moving forward.



HOW SHOULD THESE RESULTS BE USED?

The scores and ratings may be used to help teachers identify students who need additional support or more challenging work in each subject. The information will also be used to measure how well schools and school systems are helping students achieve higher expectations.

As a parent, you can use the test results to guide a discussion with your child's teacher(s) about additional supports or enrichment that may be needed in class and at home.

## Here are some suggested questions to ask when discussing the results with your child's teacher(s):

- In what areas is my child doing well and in what areas does my child need improvement?
- What can be done in the classroom to help improve my child's area(s) of weakness?
- ✓ What can be done to appropriately challenge my child in areas where expectations have been exceeded?
- How can I help support my child's learning at home?
- How do we ensure that my child continues to progress?
