

## TEACHER OF THE YEAR APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONAL VIDEO FILMING GUIDE

## **Creating the Teaching Video**

- I. Who: This guide is intended for all teachers submitting a state-level application.
- II. What: Teaching video lesson
  - The video should not exceed 30 minutes in length.
  - Videos may be edited.
  - Begin the video stating the lesson objective and expected outcomes.
  - Showcase a segment where student learning is maximized.
  - Include evidence of teacher instruction and student work.
  - Include the lesson's closure.
- III. Why: To demonstrate teacher's instructional ability
  - Video lessons will be scored using the Compass rubric.
- IV. How: Video lesson and upload
  - Before filming lesson, collect student video waivers. Keep on file at school.
  - Identify technology person with suitable videotaping skills.
  - Conduct a trail run when possible to test audio and video quality.
  - Create video, edit, and upload into video link, preferably YouTube.
    - i. Be sure video link is not marked private. Have a friend test the link before submitting.
