

Dual Enrollment Resources

Overview

Dual Enrollment is the opportunity for a student to be enrolled in high school and college at the same time. A dual enrollment student receives credit on both their high school and college transcripts for the same course. Courses are offered by local technical, community, and four-year colleges. Funding Stream for Dual Enrollment

The following funding programs can be used to fund Dual Enrollment for students:

- Minimum Foundation Program (MFP)
- <u>Title I</u> For low income students who are housed in a Title I school.
- <u>Title IV</u> AP/Dual Enrollment/ IB assessment and course-related fees for low-income students.
- <u>Title V</u> Rural Program could cover dual enrollment expenditures.
- Supplemental Course Allocation (SCA)
- Career Development Funds (CDF) CTE dual enrollment only.
- <u>Perkins</u> Only for Perkins approved CTE courses. Varies by region. Contact district CTE supervisor for Perkins-approved courses.
- Tops Tech Early Start (TTES) CTE dual enrollment only.
- Education Excellence Fund (EEF)
