In the first year of implementation, the Course Choice program will try to do a few things well: develop a multifunctional registration system, evaluate and select high-quality course offerings from credible course providers, and provide proactive program assistance to parents, educators, administrators and professional school counselors. During its start-up year Course Choice will be focused on getting things right, *not* on maximum course offerings.

In the second year of implementation and beyond, the Course Choice program will expand dramatically. *Exciting* new developments will include offering highly innovative new courses that promise to provide Louisiana students with academic and career training opportunities previously unimaginable.

Course Choice Innovation Targets will inspire industry professionals, educational entrepreneurs and great teachers to develop innovative new courses that provide the highest quality instruction to Louisiana students.

This innovation process will enable Course Choice to function as a cost-free curriculum development method, delivering cutting-edge course offerings to Louisiana students of all grades, abilities and interests.

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Innovation Targets will catalyze the development of highquality course offerings that help Louisiana students learn 21st Century job skills. Visionary Louisiana business leaders will gain access to a better-trained workforce by supporting the Course Choice program.
