- All public school facilities in the State of Louisiana are closed to students until April 13, 2020.

Prevention

As a reminder, the best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. The CDC recommends the following actions to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 (Corona Virus) and other respiratory diseases:

Academic Home Learning Opportunities

GEO Prep Academies (GBR) will not be operating a distance education program during this closure. Instead, we will be providing At Home Learning Resources. Students will receive credit based on assignments complete and points will be used to assign grades in each content area if needed. Upon scholar's return to school assessments will be given to determine mastery of skills assigned. Below you will find information about what will be provided:

- Student Work Packets to be completed and returned to school April 13, 2020. (if for some reason scholars do not return to school on April 13, 2020 a drop off time and date will be communicated for work packets drop offs) Scholars will receive participation points for completed packets.
 Odyssey Lessons in Reading and Math. Scholars are required to complete Odyssey assignments in Reading on Monday and Wednesday and Math on Tuesday and Thursday for a
 - assignments in Reading on Monday and Wednesday and Math on Tuesday and Thursday for a total of 30 minutes each day. Odyssey reports will be monitored and checked by Teachers and Administrators. One odyssey assessment should be completed each week. If a scholar does not receive 80% on the end of lesson assessment, the scholar's parent will be contacted by the teacher to provide the scholar with intervention prior to the scholar re- assessing on the odyssey skills. Scholars will receive participation points for completed odyssey lessons.
 - **Google Classroom.** Each grade level has a google classroom that will be facilitated by the grade-level teachers and administrators. Assignments will be posted for Reading/Social Studies on Monday and Wednesday and for Math/Science on Tuesday and Thursday. Friday will be a day of review for scholars to complete independent activities on standards/skills addressed earlier in the week. Teachers will post links with videos, activities, assignments, and exit tickets from CKLA, Wit and Wisdom, Eureka, Study Island, Social Studies Weekly, and/or Zearn. Daily Lessons will be uploaded with instructions by 9:00 AM. Scholars will receive participation points for completed activities.

• Teachers will be contacting parents to complete an **At Home Questionnaire**. Any scholars that do not have computer internet access they will receive additional activities via parent pick up,

	 Primary mode of instruction: All teachers have Google Classrooms that have been utilized by scholars throughout the school year. This will be the primary mode for instruction and related resources until April 13th. During this period, without in-person instruction, information related to assignments shall be posted via individual teacher's classrooms. This information may include lesson model videos, examples, and independent practice activities. Students will receive participation points for completing their daily assignments. Assignments shall be assigned and completed based on the following schedule: Mondays & Wednesdays- ELA & Social Studies Assignments, ELA Intervention Tuesdays & Thursdays - Math & Science Assignments, Math Intervention Fridays - ELA & Math (Additional Review including Interventions) ***Scholars shall complete and turn in two assignments per week for each subject.** Additional Instructional Support: Students will be required to complete some assignments via Odyssey, Zearn, Amplify, NearPod and Edulastic. Assignment links and details shall be added to teachers individual Google Classrooms. Students shall complete Odyssey assignments in ELA - Mondays/Wednesdays Students shall complete Odyssey/Zearn assignments in Math - Tuesdays/Thursdays All assignments done in Odyssey shall be monitored and checked weekly by the classroom
6-8	teachers. Any scholar scoring below proficiency (<80%), shall receive additional support/intervention from the teacher.
	Work Packets: Work packets were sent home with scholars on Friday, March 13, 2020. These packets should be completed and turned in upon your scholars return to school on Monday, April 13, 2020 . Students will receive a participation grade for completion of work packets.
	Questionnaire: Teachers will be contacting all parents to complete a support questionnaire. To provide the proper support to everyone please ensure teachers are aware of your child's needs including but not limited to internet access and technology availability.
	Teacher/Admin Support: Please find comfort in knowing that your child's teachers and administrators shall serve as support for you and your scholar/s throughout this process. Teachers will make contact with your scholars a minimum of three (3) times each week beginning Monday, March 23, 2020. Teachers will continue to use Remind and Class Dojo to communicate with parents. Please ensure that your child's teacher has up-to-date contact information to ensure that you are connected and able to receive all communication.

- **Google Classroom** Every student has access to google classroom. This is a digital platform that allows them to collaborate with their teacher and complete assignments and receive feedback and support directly from the classroom teacher. - **Remind** Remind is a messaging platform that sends communications directly to your phone. This platform provides the most current updates not only for the school, but also for each teacher.
