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*Exemption: CCAP automatically calculates additional hours during school holidays when the child is attending a full day (Ex: Spring Break or Easter Break; Thanksgiving; Christmas and New Year's).

*If a school-aged child attends full-time during the summer, a CCAP 10 Change Report Form must be submitted prior to allow full-time authorizations during this time.

* Part-time care is paid in 6 minute increments. Each full 6 minute increments equals .10 units (one-tenth of an hour). For every 6 minutes a part-time child is in care, the provider is paid .10 of the hourly rate. The chart below provides a breakdown of how part-time care is paid.

Increments Units Paid and Deducted for Authorizations

0-5 minutes	Zero
6-11 minutes	.10 units
12-17 minutes	.20 units
18-23 minutes	.30 units
24-29 minutes	.40 units
30-35 minutes	.50 units
36-41 minutes	.60 units
42-47 minutes	.70 units
48-53 minutes	.80 units
54-59 minutes	.90 units
60-65 minutes	1 unit/hour

^{*}Absences will not be covered by CCAP for children attending part-time.
