

Introduction to School Readiness Tax Credits

- Louisiana School Readiness Tax Credits (SRTCs) are tax incentives for licensed Type III child care providers.
- The SRTCs represent a \$16 million state investment in child care that helps Louisiana secure more than \$80 million in federal funding through the Child Care Development Fund (CCDF).
- These tax credits reduce the state taxes paid by individuals and businesses, dollar-for-dollar. Unlike a tax deduction, a tax credit is the whole value of the credit regardless of the tax bracket in which the taxpayer falls.
- The SRTCs are refundable, meaning they are available to taxpayers, and/or corporations, etc. even if they do not owe any taxes.

How Can I Increase My Star Rating?

The Department has several ways to increase your site's star rating.

- Teachers and administrators can obtain a scholarship to obtain the Louisiana Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate (ECAC).
- The Child Care Curriculum Initiative supports child care providers to obtain high-quality, Tier 1 curriculum.
- The Tulane University Mental Health Consultation Program (or TIKES), which
 provides Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation, has
 continued to work with Type III Centers, offering intensive intervention and
 provider-based coaching to support child care teachers and administrators.
 TIKES focuses on a child and their individual needs promoting positive
 behaviors and working toward successful transitions to kindergarten.

How Can I Increase My Star Rating?

The Department has several ways to increase your site's star rating.

- Early Childhood Community Networks throughout the state can support collaboration across school systems, local non-profits, and Child Care Resource and Referral agencies (CCR&Rs) to improve teacher-child interactions.
- CCR&Rs can provide additional interventions for low-performing early childhood sites. This process includes working with LDOE staff to complete a needs assessment and improvement plan, with monthly progress checks from LDOE staff. CCR&Rs and early childhood CNLAs are closely involved in this process.

Types of School Readiness Tax Credits

Types of School Readiness Tax Credits

There are five tax credits, which were codified in 2007, that serve as an important quality incentive:

- 1. <u>Teacher and Director Tax Credit</u> Recognizes teachers and directors for their professional education and commitment to the field.
- 2. <u>Provider Tax Credit</u> Rewards sites based on their quality rating and the number of Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) or foster care children that are served. Sites become eligible if they participate in the statewide unified quality rating system, and their benefits increase with the proportion of at-risk children they serve.
- 3. <u>Family Tax Credit</u> Supports families based on child care expenses, income, federal child care tax credit, state child care tax credit, and the quality rating of the site.

Types of School Readiness Tax Credits

- 4. <u>Business Tax Credit</u> Provides a credit for businesses that have donated funds to child care centers to support eligible child care expenses, based on the quality rating of the center.
- 5. <u>Child Care Resource and Referral Tax Credit</u> Provides a credit for businesses matched to the amount donated to Resource and Referral agencies up to \$5,000.

These tax credits reduce the taxes paid by individuals and businesses, dollar-for-dollar. Unlike a tax deduction, a tax credit is the whole value of the credit regardless of the tax bracket in which the taxpayer falls. The SRTC are refundable, meaning that they are available to a taxpayer even if they do not owe any taxes. If the SRTC exceed an individual's tax burden, then the taxpayer will receive a check for the difference after filing their taxes.

School Readiness Tax Credits for Teachers and Directors

Teacher and Director Tax Credits

The Teacher and Director Tax Credit recognizes employees for their professional education and commitment to the field.

The Teacher & Director Tax Credit is available to employees at Type III centers who meet the following criteria:

- Employed at the same Type III center for at least 6 months of the calendar year
- Worked at least an average of 30 hours per work week
- Enrolled in Louisiana Pathways

Teacher and Director Tax Credits

The Teacher & Director tax credit level is based on training and education, work experience, and professional activities differentiated by the Louisiana Pathways Career Development System:

- Administrator Career Ladder (Track)
- <u>Teacher Career Ladder (Track)</u>

School Readiness Tax Credits for Providers

Provider Tax Credits

The Provider Tax Credit rewards centers based on their quality rating and the average number of Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) or foster care children that are served.

This credit involves two tax incentives:

- Annual payments (distributed in March) to the owner of the Type III center, which is based on the average number of CCAP children served for the year
- Quarterly CCAP bonus payments based on the amount received by the provider in a quarter

Provider Quarterly Bonus Payments

These bonus payments are based on the payments received by the provider for Child Care Assistance Program and foster care children, and the star rating for that center.

The percentages for each year, January through December, are shown below:

Star Rating	Quarterly Unified Bonus Received for each Eligible Child in 2021 and beyond
5 Stars	23%
4 Stars	16.5%
3 Stars	11%



School Readiness Tax Credits for Families

Family Tax Credits

The <u>Family Tax Credit</u> supports families who enroll their children in star rated Type III and Family Child Care (FCC) centers and the amount a parent is paying for their child's care.



Family Tax Credits

This credit is claimed for children who are under the age of six and are enrolled at a Type III or Family Child Care (FCC) center rated with at least 2 stars in the quality rated system.

150%	4 stars

How Do Parents File?

The Louisiana Department of Education will mail R-10614 tax forms to eligible Type III Child Care Providers. Expect mailings in January each year.

The director should complete top portion of the form and provide the form to parents.

School Readiness Tax Credits for Businesses

Business Tax Credits

Businesses can receive a refundable tax credit through two different avenues:

- 1. Businesses can receive a tax credit based on the percentage of eligible expenses they donate in support of a child care center.
 - a. The percentage is tied to the star rating of the center. The cap on the tax credit is \$20,000.
- 2. Businesses can receive a dollar for dollar tax credit for donations to Child Care Resource & Referral Agencies up to \$5,000.

Business Tax Credit: Maximum Expenses

The <u>Business Tax Credit</u> provides a credit for businesses that have donated funds to child care centers to support eligible child care expenses.

The maximum expenses vary based on the type of donation.

Business Tax Credit: Maximum Expenses

Class of Expenses	Max Amount	% of maximum amount eligible as tax credit
Construction, renovation, expansion, or major repair of an eligible child care facility or equipment purpose	\$50,000	20% - 5 star 15% - 4 star
Payments made to an eligible child care facility for child care services to support employees	\$5,000 per child	10% - 3 star 5% - 2 star
Purchase of child care slots at eligible child care facilities for children of the business employees	\$50,000	0% - 1 star 0% - 0 star

Examples of Each Type of Business SRTC

Example 1: (Construction, renovation or repair to a facility or equipment purpose)

A construction company decides to donate \$10,000 to help a neighborhood type III child care center with 3 stars renovate a play area. The company owner would earn a \$1,000 refundable state tax credit (10% of \$10,000).

Example 2: (Payments made to an eligible child care service to support employees)

A local bank donates \$5,000 to a neighborhood type III child care center with 4 stars to help with payments for child care services to support employees. The local bank would earn a \$750 refundable state tax credit (15% of \$5,000).

School Readiness Tax Credits for Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (CCR&R)

Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) Tax Credits

Provides a credit for businesses matched to the amount donated up to \$5,000.

October 1- May 15	 Coordinate with your Lead Agency to schedule CLASS® Observations Collaborate with your CCR&R to provide coaching & support
Fall	- Performance Profile and Star Rating release
January - December	- Star Rating Effective dates (1 year)
January - April	- Families (parents), Provider, and Business can file taxes based on 2024 star rating

SRTC and VITA

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program is assisting individual tax return preparers to file taxes.

The Department and Pathways send all tax forms for family, teacher, and director School Readiness Tax Credits. These were mailed for delivery by January.

- In order to claim <u>family</u>, teacher or director School Readiness Tax Credits, you must file a tax return.
- The VITA program offers free tax help to lower-income individuals who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns. IRS-certified volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals.

What Is The SRTC Calculator?

The <u>School Readiness Tax Credit (SRTC) calculator</u> is a tool that maybe used to estimate the total amount of the provider tax credit, bonus payments, and staff tax credits that your site may be eligible for.

How To Use The SRTC Calculator

This tool may be used to estimate the total amount of provider tax credit, bonus payments, and staff tax credits that your site would be eligible for . This reflects the amount providers can expect to earn in tax credits. Please note that these are estimates only based on self-reported information, and should not be taken as any guarantee of payment or funds.
