

What is Early Childhood Accountability? The Early Childhood Education Act



"[Act 3] calls for the creation of a statewide, integrated early childhood care and education network which will establish uniform standards of readiness for kindergarten and, through coordination with other state agencies, align all standards for quality early-child education."

What is Early Childhood Accountability? Measuring quality of care

Louisiana uses the CLASS® rating tool to measure quality. CLASS® is a research-based, nationally regarded measure that assesses how well teachers interact with the children under their care.

- Update the Early Childhood CLASS® Portal
- Submit a local observation protocol
- Observe every classroom at each publicly-funded site
- Conduct shadow scoring and observer calibration activities

Creating an Effective System Spring CLASS® observation activities

- Observe every classroom at each publicly-funded site
- Conduct shadow scoring and observer calibration activities
- Ensure that every classroom has a local observation

CLASS® Observations: A Closer Look

CLASS® Observation Requirements Center directors or principals

- Communicate classroom and lead teacher updates to lead agency
- Communicate with local and third party observers as appropriate
- Facilitate observation rescheduling
- Greet observer upon arrival to site
- Report feedback to lead teacher



CLASS® Observation RequirementsObservers



- Maintain CLASS® reliability and CCCBC
- Alert lead agency to conflicts of interest
- Adhere to observation protocol
- Report any suspected abuse or neglect as mandated by law

CLASS® Observation Requirements Early childhood teachers


- Alert director or principal of any conflicts of interest with observer
- Respond to (minimal) communication with observer and site administration
- Teach and provide care as normal






