The Site Performance Profile provides information on the site's quality. It highlights the site's classroom quality and use of best practices to help parents make informed child care choices for their children.

## **Measures of Classroom Quality**

Louisiana's publicly-funded Early Childhood classrooms are observed using CLASS®, a nationally recognized tool. These in-depth measures show how well classroom interactions support children's growth and development.

Pre-K (3-4 years)	<b>Emotional Support:</b> Creating a warm, positive place where children feel safe to explore their classroom and connect with others
	<b>Classroom Organization:</b> Organizing the classroom and environment to manage children's attention, time, and behavior.
	Instructional Support: Helping children learn creatively through conversation and connecting classroom experiences with the rest of the world.
Toddler (1-2 years)	<b>Emotional and Behavioral Support:</b> Responding to children's emotions and organizing the classroom to manage behavior and the ability to interact with others.
	<b>Engaged Support for Learning:</b> Interacting with children to develop their thinking, language skills, and overall development.
Infant (0-12 months)	Responsive Caregiving: Managing the overall quality of infant care, including caring interactions, perspective-taking, and responding to infant language.
