P-EBT Talking Points

Pandemic EBT, or P-EBT, is for the families of students who...

- were eligible for free or reduced-price school meals, AND
- haven't been able to access those meals on campus every day because they're on virtual or hybrid learning schedules due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

An **estimated 259,000 students are eligible** to receive P-EBT for the 2020-21 school year. (Served 284,000 families last year, when all schools were closed.)

Changes from last year's P-EBT program:

• NO APPLICATION NEEDED!

- Schools will provide lists of eligible students to DCFS, and
- We'll issue each eligible student a P-EBT card based on the information the schools provide.
- **QUESTIONS about Eligibility Status:** Reach out to the child's school or district. They are making those determinations and providing information on eligible students to DCFS.
- One card per child in student's name
 - These will be NEW cards, <u>not</u> last year's P-EBT cards (and <u>not</u> on SNAP recipients' SNAP cards).
 - **Parents will need their child's Student ID number to activate the child's card**, rather than a Social Security Number. If they don't have that information, they'll need to reach out to their child's school.
- Issued in installments, starting this Summer
 - First installment will cover the months of August 2020 October 2020
 - Please be patient. Will take a while to issue all the cards.
 - Timing is not the same for everyone.
 - Will depend on when each school submits their students' info
 - Families with more than one child may receive their children's cards at different times, depending on when we get each child's info.

How much in benefits...

- Depends on their learning schedule:
 - \$48.23 per month for hybrid
 - **\$120.71** per month for **fully virtual**
- Schools will provide student info to DCFS
