Overview

The Fast Forward Social Sciences (CIP 45) pathway has one Associate Degree opportunity through Nunez Community College.

This pathway prepares students with a focus on the general study of human social behavior and social institutions using any of the methodologies common to the social sciences and/or history or an undifferentiated program of study in the social sciences.

Guidance Overview

This guidance is meant to help school systems and parents navigate the opportunities to complete an Associate Degree in high school. School systems should verify information with the post-secondary institution to ensure students are enrolled in the appropriate college classes to earn the associates degree. This guidance includes:

- <u>Post-Secondary Degree Paths</u> details all courses required for the Applied Associate Degree. The
 Applied Associate Degree has limited general education courses and is primarily designed to prepare
 students for immediate employment or career entry.
- <u>Secondary Courses not included in the Post-Secondary Program of Study</u> detail all courses the student must take prior to or in tandem with the college courses to meet secondary graduation requirements. Typically, these are courses students are scheduled to take in grades 9 and 10.
- <u>Capstone Credentials</u> details all Industry Based Certifications a student can receive to complete the Applied Associate Degree. Students working towards a Jump Start Diploma must complete at least one capstone credential to graduate.
- <u>High School Transcription</u> details the LDOE course code a counselor should use to transcribe the college courses that do not have a dedicated LDOE course code.
