

Jump Start 2.0 Pre-Apprenticeship: Electrician

Pre-Apprenticeship Partner: Electrical Training Alliance (ETA)

## Overview

The electrician pre-apprenticeship is designed to prepare students to enter and succeed in electrical registered Apprenticeship programs, as well as explore the skills of the trade. This electrical pre-apprenticeship program provides students with the knowledge and skills necessary for advanced placement into a post-secondary electrical apprenticeship program. This includes the introduction of tools and materials that an electrician will use on a daily basis, workplace soft skills needed to succeed and instruction in basic electrical theories. High School graduates who are 18 or older and hold the credential can apply to any of the 270 electrical apprenticeship programs across the country that are associated with the International Brotherhood of Electricians or with local electricians willing to hire the students. High school graduates are eligible to apply to any IBEW-affiliated apprenticeship program after earning the Interim Credentials advanced IBC, , but cannot be hired as an apprentice until they turn 18 years of age.
