High School Graduation Pathways

TOPS University

The **TOPS University Diploma** is intended for those students who aspire to enter a 4-year university, immediately or soon following graduation.

Students must choose a total of at least 24 Carnegie Unit credits and maintain a minimum GPA calculated from core subjects and the Foreign Language subject.

TOPS Tech/“Jump Start”

Jump Start/TOPS Tech is Louisiana’s Career and Technical Education program. Through Jump Start students earn industry credentials while still in high school.

Jump Start students graduate high school prepared to secure a high-wage job *and* attend a technical or community college.

All students, including those on a TOPS University pathway, can earn industry credentials in high school.

TOPS University Students...

- plan on attending a four-year college or university;
- receive a liberal arts education laying the foundation for scholarly success;
- are competitive for in-state scholarship funding based on course completion and meeting specific GPA requirements;
- can obtain industry credentials while in high school.

TOPS Tech “Jump Start” Students...

- attain industry credentials that employers value when deciding who to hire for entry-level positions;
- complete Introductory Career Essentials courses where students master workplace “soft skills” that help them find good jobs and succeed when they report to their first jobs;
- complete internships (either workplace internships or “virtual workplace experiences”) during high school that teach them about the world of work;
- complete course work that enables Jump Start students to continue their education, through employer training, technical college courses and eventually (if they want) at a four year university.

High School Industry Based Certifications

Industry Based Certification. A credential, usually issued by an industry or industry group, that verifies that an individual has met the skill standards established by that industry or industry group, as minimal requirements to successfully enter the workforce and compete in that particular occupational area.

Apprenticeship Training

In today's industry, there is a great demand for qualified individuals in a wide variety of occupations. **Apprenticeship training** is an agreement between a person wishing to learn a skill and an employer who can provide the environment for skills training. **Apprentices** are usually paid to learn.

One element that differentiates an Apprenticeship Program from other programs is the alignment and connectivity between academic learning and hands-on, practical on the job training.
