You might work as a driver, pilot, engineer, or captain. Or, you might work behind the scenes to make sure the products and people get to the right place on time.

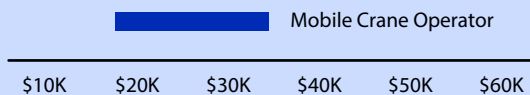
