Testing Details (including any age requirements / accommodations)	To take the CCA exam, a student must have a high school diploma or equivalent. Other recommendations include but not required: • 6 months coding experience directly applying codes: OR • Completion of an AHIMA approved coding program (PCAP Program); OR • Completion of other coding training program to include anatomy & physiology, medical terminology, BASIC ICD (International Classification of Diseases) diagnostic/procedural and BASIC CPT (Common Procedural Terminology) coding. For complete information, read the Candidate Guide carefully which includes information regarding applying for the CCA exam, pg. 8. Students that complete the coding curriculum competencies at the high school level may likely only require one additional year at a post-secondary institution to earn an associate degree in Health Information management (HIT) and be eligible for the Health Information Technician (RHIT) credential. For details on the competencies and requirements visit CAHIIM. Candidates must obtain an Authorization to Test (ATT) letter before applying to take the test. The CCA® exam is two hours long with no breaks. There are 100 multiple-choice questions. 90 questions are scored and 10 pretest questions are not. These 10 questions as used for possible inclusion in future tests and cannot be distinguished by the candidate. The current passing scaled score for the CCA exam is 300 out of 400.
