Description of Credential	Commercial Driver’s License (CDL) class “C” credential allows 18 year old students that have obtained a valid personal driver’s license (E”) to operate vehicles in the classes of “D” that are defined as “Light Vehicles”. This class has a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) of 26,000 or less pounds designed to transport 16 or more passengers, including the driver, which are not in commercial groups “A” or “B” and not used to transport hazardous materials. Additional endorsements can be obtained with specific requirements. (i.e. airbrakes, double/triple trailers, etc.)

Re-Testing (if available)	Re-Testing Procedures	Students may take the basic knowledge test (50 questions) indefinitely without paying re-test fees but must wait 24 hours before re-taking the test.			Max Attempts	Skills test may be taken 4 times with initial fee.								
Testing Details (including any age requirements / accommodations)	<p>The age requirement is 18 and older for Intrastate and 21 and older for interstate. The number of written test questions may change with each type of endorsement. Other Details	Expiration Timeframe?	CDL licenses expire in Louisiana in 6 years. Anyone can renew up to 180 days before expiration. A renewal letter is sent 90 days prior to expiration. A self-certification form in addition to a current physical examination and medical examiner's certificate must be submitted upon renewal.

Cost Details	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) A CDL physical is required (fee set by the medical examiner).</li> <li>b) \$15 application fee.</li> <li>c) Third Party Skills test is \$100 (if you provide the vehicle). NOTE: Cost for rental of a vehicle, discretion of the Tester/Examiner.</li> <li>d) License fee – (Cash only) \$61.50 (\$76.50 if you reside in Orleans Parish).</li> <li>e) Service fee is \$0 - \$6.00</li> <li>f) Additional endorsements - \$5 each, except for motorcycle which is \$8.</li> <li>g) Applicable parish fee - not to exceed \$3.</li> </ul> For information concerning costs, see <a href="#">Section J, Policy 2.00 Fees and Duration of License</a> .
