FUTURE HOME TO COLLEGIATE ACADEMIES

- * Collegiate Academies currently operates three high schools: Sci Academy, G.W. Carver Collegiate Academy, and G.W. Carver Preparatory Academy.
- * Collegiate Academies will launch a new high school at the Livingston facility beginning in 2016 and will graduate its first class in 2020.
- * Collegiate Academies schools serve students who are predominantly low-income and often over-aged when entering 9th grade.
- * Collegiate Academies outperforms the city average in students graduating on time and enrolling in college. 75% of students in Sci Academy's class of 2014 graduated in four years, compared to 73% of students citywide, and 73% of Sci Academy 2014 graduates enrolled in college, compared to 59% of graduates citywide.
- * In 2014, 71% of all Collegiate Academies students scored good or excellent on End-of-Course exams, compared to 59% of students citywide.
- * 67% of all Collegiate Academies current students live in New Orleans East.

FUTURE HOME TO MCDONOGH 42 ELEMENTARY CHARTER SCHOOL

- * McDonogh 42 Elementary School has been open under Choice Foundation since 2012 and currently enrolls 453 students in grades PK-8.
- * McDonogh 42 is part of the Choice Foundation network, which also includes Lafayette Academy and Esperanza Charter School. In total, the Choice Foundation network enrolls over 1,800 students serving grades PK-8.
- * McDonogh 42 earned the state's "Top Gains" designation in 2014. McDonogh 42's SPS increased from 39.4 in 2013 to 58.3 in 2014.
- * McDonogh 42's serves a predominantly low-income student population, with 96% of students qualifying as economically disadvantaged, compared to a citywide average of 82%.

FUTURE HOME TO ARISE ACADEMY

- * Arise Academy has been open since 2009 and currently enrolls 425 students in grades K-7. Arise is growing to serve grades K-8.
- * Arise Academy earned a 5-year charter renewal extension in 2013 for meeting and surpassing performance marks.
- * Arise Academy serves a higher than average percentage of students with disabilities at 17%, compared to an 11% citywide average.
- * Arise Academy serves a predominantly low-income student population, with 98% of students qualifying as economically disadvantaged, compared to a citywide average of 82%.
- * 86% of current Arise students live in or adjacent to the new building's zip code.

FUTURE HOME TO CHOICE FOUNDATION

- * The Choice Foundation network of schools includes Lafayette Academy, McDonogh 42 Elementary School and Esperanza Charter School. In total, the Choice Foundation network enrolls over 1,800 students, serving grades PK-8.
- * Choice Foundation will temporarily use Dunbar as an extension site for pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students from Lafayette Academy, ultimately launching a new PK-8 elementary school at the site.
- * Lafayette Academy, Choice Foundation's first school, outperformed the city average on state assessments in 2014, with 69% of students scoring at or above grade level compared to the citywide average of 64%.
- * McDonogh 42 and Esperanza earned the state's "Top Gains" designation in 2014. McDonogh 42's SPS increased from 39.4 in 2013 to 58.3 in 2014. Esperanza's SPS increased from 75.3 in 2013 to 85.6 in 2014.
- * Choice Foundation serves a predominantly low-income student population, with 93% of students at all schools qualifying as economically disadvantaged compared to a citywide average of 82%.

FUTURE HOME TO MARY MCLEOD BETHUNE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL OF LITERATURE AND TECHNOLOGY

- * Mary Bethune Elementary is an open enrollment traditional public school operated by the Orleans Parish School Board. It currently enrolls 414 students in grades PK-6.
- * Bethune Elementary earned a 93.7 SPS (B letter grade) in 2014, outperforming New Orleans' district performance score of 83.4 (C letter grade).
- * Bethune Elementary outperformed the city average on state assessments in 2014, with 80% of students scoring at or above grade level compared to the citywide average of 64%. 78% of Bethune students passed state assessments in 2013.
- * Bethune Elementary serves a predominantly low-income student population, with 90% of students qualifying as economically disadvantaged, compared to a citywide average of 82%.
