

Annually, the ACT release a "Condition of College and Career Readiness" report that outlines progress of the most recent, ACT-tested graduating class. This fact sheet reflects data from the 2016 report.

#### **LOUISIANA'S ACT FAST FACTS**

- According to the 2016 ACT Annual Report, Louisiana's composite score of 19.5 ranks 13<sup>th</sup> of 18 states in which 100 percent of students take the test. Louisiana ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> of seven states in the South.
- Since 2014, Louisiana has closed the performance gap with the national average by .5. While the nation's average composite score has declined 0.2 since 2014, Louisiana's increased 0.3 points from 19.2 in 2014 to 19.5 in 2016.
- Louisiana students average performance that is closer to the national average than in 2014 in every subject tested by the ACT.

## **ACT IN LOUISIANA**

In 2012, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education adopted policy to give all high school students access to the ACT free of charge, as part of a comprehensive package to increase access to college and a career for high school students. This initiative was first put in place in 2013; the graduating class of 2014 was the first class to have all seniors take the ACT.

The 2016 ACT Annual Report calculates Louisiana's average score for all public and private school students using a student's "most recent score" which uses only the score achieved the last time the student took the test.

## **LOUISIANA'S ACT RESULTS**

### **Outpacing States Testing All Graduates**

Of the 18 states testing 100 percent of all graduates, Louisiana's average composite score for all public and private school testers is higher than five of those states. Louisiana also finished 3<sup>rd</sup> among 7 Southern states. Louisiana ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> among these states for progress since 2015 and 1<sup>st</sup> for gains over the last two years.




## **Outpacing the Nation**

2016 marks the third consecutive year of growth by Louisiana students, representing an increase of 0.3 points since 2014. In that same time, the national average ACT composite score for all students, including states that only test select populations, decreased 0.2 points to 20.8.



# **Students Meeting ACT College Readiness Benchmarks**

Since 2014, Louisiana has steadily reduced the national gaps between the percent of students meeting ACT College Readiness Benchmarks in every subject.



### **Life Benefit for Louisiana Graduates**

Since Louisiana began requiring all public high school students in grade 11 to take the ACT series in 2013, the state has seen a <u>dramatic increase in the number of seniors earning qualifying scores</u> for TOPS Tech (17+), TOPS Opportunity (20+), and TOPS Honors (27+), boosting both students on the TOPS University pathway and the Jump Start TOPS Tech



pathway. A record 25,144 public high school seniors in the class of 2016 earned a college-going score (18+), an increase of 462 students from 24,682 in 2015 and an increase of 6,837 students since 2012. Furthermore, the number of students eligible for TOPS awards at every level due to ACT achievement has reached record highs.
