New Orleans Early Education Network (NOEEN)

Per Act 3 of the 2012 Regular Legislative Session, Agenda for Children, in cooperation with local early childhood providers and the Louisiana Department of Education (LDE), created the New Orleans Early Education Network (NOEEN) in 2013 to coordinate early childhood care and education standards, evaluations, observations, enrollment, and funding in Orleans Parish.

In Summer 2015, LDE officially named Agenda for Children as the Lead

Agency for NOEEN.

NOEEN includes <u>all</u> 150 schools and private providers in Orleans Parish receiving public funds to serve over 5,500 children birth through fiveyears-olds.



41 Public Schools



9 Non-Public Schools



21 Head Start and Early Head Start Centers



89 Child Care Centers

The NOEEN Vision

NOEEN will have a collective impact on the early childhood sector in New Orleans by increasing at-risk children's access to quality early care and education and by designing and implementing a systematic approach to improve the quality of all publicly funded early learning programs.

A few of the activities associated with this work include:

- → Leadership and decision-making by the NOEEN Steering Committee;
- → Twice yearly CLASS observations;
- → Coordinated enrollment for all publicly-funded children in Orleans Parish through EnrollNOLA/OneApp;
- → Administration of the Preschool Expansion Grant by Agenda for Children; and
- → Making a coordinated funding request to LDE for all state early childhood funding streams.

A Unified Approach

BESE Bulletin 140 requires the Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) to work with each Lead Agency to unify funding requests from each provider in the network for "seats" in statefunded early childhood programs (LA4, NSECD, Allocated CCAP, and Preschool Expansion Grant) into a single, annual "coordinated funding request."

The goal of NOEEN's 2016-17 Coordinated Funding Request is to ensure that the limited number of publicly-funded early childhood seats are allocated to those programs that:

- → Address citywide needs;
- → Are high quality; and
- → Are in high demand by parents.

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Letter of Intent

Who is required to fill out the Letter of Intent?

Operators interested in seats for LA4, NSECD, Preschool Expansion Grant, or Allocated CCAP seats

- → Operators wanting to keep existing seats in 2016-17
- → Operators wanting to increase the number of seats at their site for 2016-17
- → Operators wanting to participate in a new/different funding stream for 2016-17

What will the Letter of Intent be used for?

- ◆ Gather information regarding your organization's plans to serve seats for the 2016-17 school year
- → Design the application and site visit process to accommodate the number of programs requesting seats
- → Facilitate prospective partnerships for the Preschool Expansion Grant for interested schools and centers.

No seats are guaranteed to any providers as part of this process. Even if NOEEN recommends that your organization receive seats all allocations are dependent on decisions by LDE and BESE.

LA4

- The Cecil J. Picard LA4 Early Childhood Program is the primary preschool program in the state, with 37 different public schools serving more than 1,500 four-year-olds from low-income families in Orleans Parish.
- The LDE works to ensure that the total number of LA4 seats allocated to public schools in Orleans Parish is at least equal to the number of LA4 seats the previous year. However, the total number of seats available statewide are limited, and additional LA4 seats in Orleans Parish for 2016-17 are not guaranteed.

NSECD

- The Nonpublic School Early Childhood Development (NSECD) Program provides four-yearolds from low-income families the opportunity to attend preschool in state-approved nonpublic schools and early learning centers.
- The LDE works to ensure that the total number of NSECD seats allocated to programs in Orleans Parish is at least equal to the number of LA4 seats the previous year. However, the total number of seats available statewide are limited, and additional NSECD seats in Orleans Parish for 2016-17 are not guaranteed.

Allocated CCAP Seats

- This is a new grant opportunity from the Louisiana Department of Education available to licensed Type III early learning centers to serve infants through three-year-olds in full-year programs.
- Centers that receive CCAP Allocated Seats may also accept CCAP voucher children.
- Additional information on this new grant is forthcoming from LDE.

Preschool Expansion Grant

The Preschool Expansion Grant (PEG) is made possible by federal dollars provided to Louisiana to expand quality preschool seats for four-year-olds from low-income families at early learning centers in partnership with public schools.
