Online Pre-work for Literacy for 21st Century Teachers and Learners

- Why Literacy? Why Now?
 - The gap that exists between literacy and illiteracy has continually widened in the modern day. The Louisiana Legislature adopted Act 108 to strengthen literacy teaching and learning in early childhood grades.
 - Learners in today's society must be skilled in reading, writing, speaking, and listening, and teachers must be equipped to instruct in these areas effectively."Every teacher is a reading teacher."

• The Simple View of Reading (SVR) and Scarborough's Reading Rope

- Basis: Independent Reading is the PRODUCT of two separate skills: Decoding / Phonics and Language Comprehension.
 - You have to know how to break down a word to read/say it. You have to be able to connect a word with other words/knowledge in order to understand it.
 - Automaticity is the process by which reading is "effortless" and "automatic." Automaticity is key for a child to reach reading comprehension.

Fundamental Components of Reading and Literacy

- We often identify children as literate if they can read and write well. It's a limiting approach where letteracy is misunderstood as literacy. Larry Mikulecky makes the analogy that "Literacy is to reading as mathematics is to counting."
- Students proficient in reading (reading is a part of literacy) are found to excel in communication skills, confidence, vocabulary, expression, and above all in, cognitive abilities.
 - Components of Literacy: Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening/Reasoning--All with COMPREHENSION!
 - Components of Reading: Phonemic Awareness, Phonics, Fluency, Vocabulary, Comprehension

Applying Literacy Techniques Across the Curricula

- Kindergarten-5th Grade--Teach ALL Standards, including the RF Standards through HQIM!
- Kindergarten-12th Grade (All Subjects)--Read, write, listen, and speak EVERY DAY.
