BESE SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICER RESOLUTION 1

Mr. Michael Melerine 4th BESE District To urge and request the governing authorities of the public elementary and secondary schools in the State of Louisiana provide for a school resource officer for all schools under its jurisdiction.

WHEREAS, the Constitution of Louisiana states that the goal of the public education system is to provide learning environments and experiences, at all stages of human development, that are humane, just, and designed to promote excellence in order that every individual may be afforded an equal opportunity to develop to his full potential; and

WHEREAS, incidences of shooting and other acts of violence and terrorism continue to occur in schools, on school buses, and at school-related activities and pose a significant threat to the safety and well-being of students, teachers, and school employees; and

WHEREAS, incidences of shooting and other acts of violence and terrorism foster a climate of fear that can seriously impair and affect the physical and psychological health of students, faculty, and staff and create conditions that negatively affect teaching and learning; and

WHEREAS, protecting the school environment and preventing the loss of life and injury to students and teachers and other school employees are governmental interests of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, LA R. S. 17:416.9, provides that any city, parish, or other local public school system and any nonpublic school may make or enter into agreements with a local law enforcement agency to provide for school resource officers; and

WHEREAS, a school resource officer shall be certified by a nationally accredited school resource officer program or a state school resource officer training program certified by the Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training; and

WHEREAS, a school resource officer can work in collaboration with schools, law enforcement agencies, and community-based organizations in order to implement school safety and security practices and procedures to prevent crime and protect students, faculty, and staff; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education does hereby urge and request that each Louisiana public school system enter into agreements with a local law enforcement agency to provide for a school resource officer at every public school and to annually report to the state Department of Education the total number of school resource officers provided to the system; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the governing authority of each public Louisiana Education Agency (LEA).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Elementary and Secondary Edcuation does hereby urge and request that each Louisiana public school system be allocated adequate funding to enter into agreements with a local law enforcement agency to provide for a school resource officer at every public school.
