SUBJECT: FY2014-2015 MFP Pay Raise Requirement

The FY2014-2015 MFP formula includes a provision requiring that teacher pay raises resulting of legislative appropriation in 2013 be at least sustained for 2014-2015. The following provides details regarding the requirement.

- If a city, parish, or local public school system or other public school has a net increase from 2013-2014 to 2014-2015 in its per student Level 1 and 2 State Cost Allocation, the city, parish, or local public school system or other public school shall be required to sustain the certificated classroom teacher pay raises provided by the 2013-2014 appropriation.
- If a city, parish, or local public school system or other public school has established plans to sustain or increase the teacher pay raises provided for by the 2013-2014 appropriation prior to the development of the 2014-2015 MFP formula, then this provision does not apply. For example, if the FY2013-2014 MFP pay raise funds were provided to classroom teachers as a permanent pay increase, the requirements for the FY2014-2015 pay raises funds has been satisfied. However, for those LEAs that provided the FY2013-2014 pay raise funds as a one-time stipend or supplement, those LEAs must use increased funding to continue the stipends or supplements provided in the prior year.
- Employees eligible for the pay increase are certificated classroom teachers.
 - Certificated classroom teachers are defined by BESE Bulletin 1929 as classroom teachers (function code series 1000 through 1600, object code 112), including those certificated classroom teachers on sabbatical.
