

March 2016 BESE Summary

The Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) met last Friday, March 4. A summary of board actions that directly impact the activities of local education agencies are listed below.

Any bulletin revisions, with the exception of emergency rules, must run in the Louisiana Register as a Notice of Intent for 90 days and complete the rulemaking process before becoming rule and appearing in the bulletins on the BESE website. Approval of the Louisiana K-12 Content Standards for English Language Arts (ELA) and Math

Louisiana Revised Statute 17:24.4 requires the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to develop state content standards for required subjects to be taught in the public elementary and secondary schools in Louisiana. Act 329 of the 2015 Regular Session provided for the review and development of state content standards for English language arts and mathematics. In response to Act 329, the Board convened a steering committee and three content subcommittees to review and develop the standards. Last week, the Board approved the Louisiana K-12 Content Standards for English language arts and math.

Revisions to Bulletin 126, Charter Schools, relative to Type 2 charter school residency requirements

The Board approved revisions which require Type 2 charter schools to collect documents from families confirming the residency of their students and verifying the correct city or parish school district in which the student resides.

In response to <u>Senate Resolution 162 of the 2015 Regular Session</u>, the Board approved revisions to bulletins to include AP Computer Science A as an Advanced Math class to align the TOPS University Diploma requirements with the TOPS core curriculum.
