

Materials and Resources to Support Learning Loss

September 2023

In the Division of Academic Content, we are excited to hear and see the energy with which school systems have begun this school year! We are grateful for school system leaders who are committed to excellence and are honored to work alongside, ensuring the support we offer can be best leveraged for teachers. As we continue to think about ways to help school systems in **addressing learning loss experienced** over the last three and a half years, we are pleased to share that **the following materials have been ordered to assist your teachers and students and will be arriving over the next weeks**.

Below is a summary of what your school system will receive and from where, how it should be used, and how it connects with learning loss and the priority work of LDOE and our other resources. Attached you'll find a <u>detailed checklist</u> that you can use for distribution. Please note that these materials belong to the school; if a teacher leaves the school, the materials should remain at the school.

Math

To support implementing the <u>Math Refresh initiative</u>, **grade-level specific math manipulatives and instructional games** are coming to every grade K-8 math teacher. These resources will be used for instruction in math classrooms to assist students in building knowledge and skills as expected by grade-level math standards. The Department is committed to supporting teachers with the necessary tools to teach math effectively. Incorporation of the provided resources will encourage student engagement while also developing math skills and deepening conceptual understanding of math content.

You will receive a shipment from Lakeshore containing enough materials for all regular and special education math teachers. These resources will vary by grade level. Social Studies

To support implementation of new social studies standards, **world maps** are being provided to every social studies teacher in the K-8 grade level. These maps will be used for instruction in social studies classrooms throughout the state to assist students in mastering grade-level geography standards. The Department is committed to providing teachers with the necessary resources to effectively teach social studies. Consistent use of physical maps help students develop their geography skills and knowledge, a key component of the 2022 Louisiana Student Standards for Social Studies.

You will receive a shipment from Barnes & Noble with enough maps to distribute one per social studies teacher in the K-8 grade level. As deemed appropriate, any extra maps received may be distributed to additional teachers (e.g., ELA, etc.). In the coming months, the Department will attempt to procure a second shipment of world maps for each 9-12

Additionally, school systems participating in the Bayou Bridges Pilot Program for grades 4-5 will receive a package of resources for teachers and students. To support teachers with the initial implementation, teachers in grades 4-5 will receive student folders, desk notepads, pens, and journals to help students take notes and keep materials organized. A shipment from State Printing will be sent to you with sufficient items to distribute to teachers and students in grades 4-5. Science

To broaden student access to high-quality science in high school biology, chemistry, and physics, school systems will receive **teacher professional learning and student materials to support implementation of OpenSciEd courses** in the three content areas. These resources will be used for instruction in science classrooms to assist students in building knowledge and skills as expected by grade-level science standards. The Department is committed to supporting teachers with the necessary tools to teach science effectively. Teachers for each course will receive

- Access to the digital platform from Activate Learning for available units
- Kit materials for available units from ECA Science Kit Services
- Introductory and ongoing Professional Learning opportunities

Additional information will be shared in the October Teaching and Learning call on how systems should proceed with registering teachers for professional learning associated with implementation of these high-quality science materials. ELA

To support teachers in implementing research-based strategies to improve their students' writing skills during instruction using their high-quality instructional materials, copies of the text, *The Writing Revolution: A Guide to Advancing Writing in All Subjects and Grades*, by Judith C. Hochman and Natalie Wexler are being provided to all ELA teachers in grades 3-5. This text will support all teachers in understanding The Hochman Method and how it supports students in writing with structure, clarity, and coherence. The text will further support teachers who are implementing the ELA Guidebooks 3-5 (2022) units with embedded writing activities using <u>The Writing Revolution</u>[©] (TWR) strategies by deepening their understanding of the TWR activities embedded in the curriculum. Teachers can refer to this resource as



they plan to teach and internalize ELA Guidebooks 3-5 (2022) unit lessons. The TWR strategies are defined and explained for teachers to make a connection to the sequence of the writing progression and leveling of units. These strategies practice specific skills using a variety of scaffolds. This practice, paired with targeted teacher feedback, offers a coherent method of support to create effective communicators in writing, as well as deepen understanding of content.

To support teachers in understanding diverse learners with varying challenges in reading, copies of the text, *Basic Facts about Dyslexia & Other Reading Problems*, by Louisa Cook Moats are being provided to all grade 1-12 ELA teachers. This resource includes research to inform educators about 1) the research-based definition of dyslexia; 2) the various stages of development with dyslexia; 3) the effects of reading difficulties on emotions; 4) research on genetics; 5) effective reading instruction; and 6) options for treating dyslexia in severe cases and other reading problems.

To support teachers in understanding the importance of knowledge building, copies of *The Knowledge Gap: The Hidden Cause of America's Broken Education System – and How to Fix it* by Natalie Wexler are being provided for all ELA classroom teachers of grades pre-kindergarten through 12. This resource will guide teachers in supporting students with acquiring the knowledge and vocabulary that will enable them to succeed.

You will receive a shipment from Barnes & Noble containing enough copies of

- The Writing Revolution: A Guide to Advancing Writing in All Subjects and Grades, by Judith C. Hochman and Natalie Wexler books to distribute to your ELA teachers in grades 3-5,
- Basic Facts about Dyslexia & Other Reading Problems, by Louisa Cook Moats books to distribute to your ELA teachers in grades 1-10, and
- The Knowledge Gap: The Hidden Cause of America's Broken Education System and How to Fix it to distribute to your ELA teachers in grades pre-k through 12.

To support ELA teachers in deepening their understanding of the science of reading, copies of the *Science of Reading: Defining Guide* from <u>The Reading League</u> are being provided for all ELA classroom teachers of grades pre-kindergarten through 12. This guide encompasses 50 years of research conducted internationally to inform educators how to develop proficient reading and writing, why some students experience challenges in literacy, and how to effectively assess, teach, and improve student outcomes.

You will receive a shipment from The Reading League containing enough copies of *Science of Reading: Defining Guide* to **distribute to your ELA teachers in grades pre-k through 12**. EdTech

To support all teachers in enhancing state-approved curriculums into interactive and engaging platforms, K-12 teachers statewide will receive <u>Kami Teacher</u> licenses beginning in November and through the 2024-2025 school year that will allow teachers to access the entire suite of <u>Kami features</u>. Beyond its utility as a PDF document viewer, Kami acts as a bridge, fostering engagement and deepening comprehension. Whether it is highlighting text, voice annotation, or video integration, Kami's multifaceted features are tailored to support diverse learning styles, ensuring that every student in Louisiana has the tools they need to succeed in the digital age. Kami **seamlessly integrates** with <u>Google Classroom</u>, <u>Schoology</u>, <u>Canvas</u>, and <u>Microsoft Teams</u>, so teachers can assign, assess, and give feedback all in one place. For example, teachers have the ability to take extended PDF documents, select relevant pages, and then share that out to their students with a few mouse clicks.

School systems can begin onboarding their staff in November. Virtual professional development will be offered this summer and throughout the 2024-2025 school year. If you have any questions or concerns regarding how to use or access this resource, please contact <u>digitallearning@la.gov</u>.

World Languages

To support implementation of French Immersion Language Arts, **school systems with a French Immersion School will receive grade-level specific titles from the Prix Albertine Jeunesse initiative for all FLA classroom teachers** of grades pre-kindergarten through 12. These children's literature books with the online pedagogical resources will be used for instruction in French Language Arts classrooms to assist students in building biliteracy skills as expected by grade-level immersion standards. The Department is committed to supporting teachers with the necessary tools to teach literacy, including biliteracy, effectively.

You will receive a shipment from the Garden District Book Shop via the Council on the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) with a detailed materials list to distribute to your FLA teachers.
