Classroom Environment

- A positive classroom environment happens when teachers intentionally look for, honor, and acknowledge the values, attributes, and strengths that make every student unique.
- Research has shown that an engaged learning environment:
 - Increases students' attention and focus.
 - Promotes meaningful learning experiences.
 - Encourages higher levels of student performance.
 - Motivates students to practice higher-level critical thinking skills.

Building Relationships

- Relationships are the key to making **everything** work.
- What motivates one child will not motivate the next; they're all different.

• Establishing Clear Behavioral Expectations

- Establishing consistent classroom expectations is a key foundational principle of classroom management.
- Creating clear boundaries and steady routines help students understand what is expected of them throughout each school day.
- This type of consistency allows students to direct their focus on learning rather than playing the guessing game when it comes to expected behaviors.
- This approach helps students avoid learning bad habits from each other or wasting valuable time picking up bits and pieces as they go.
