Serious Injury or Death

Louisiana Department of Education must ensure that this localized list includes a clear indicator if a serious injury or death due to a substantiated health and safety violation has occurred at that provider. It is crucial that parents are able to clearly identify if a provider had a violation that led to the death of a child or a serious injury. In 2017 the Department changed the definition to specify the type of serious injury or death that occurred while a child was in the care of an early learning center.

Serious Injury as defined by the Department is an Injury that occurs due to a substantiated health and safety violation while a child is in the care of an early learning center, family home provider or in-home provider and that requires medical attention. Examples include but are not limited to broken bones, cuts requiring stitches, injury of internal organs, burns and head trauma.

This document includes all serious injuries and deaths that occurred in the state of Louisiana from 2017-2021.

-Provider failed to have C1's parents sign, date, and indicate a time of written notification of the critical incident form in regards to critical incident on 1/13/17 when C1 fell on the centers play yard and broke her leg.

1509-A.1: Child Abuse and Neglect Policy: Based on observation/interview: Although mandated reporters, staff did not report suspected abuse/neglect of a child to the Child Protection Statewide Hotline as on 9/29/17, S18 neglected to attend to C1 after he was injured due to a hazardous propped table that fell on his right foot. Specialist's review of the center's video camera footage which showed C1 laying on the floor for more than 5 minutes without being checked on by S18 after the injured occurred. When C1 finally attempted to lift himself from the ground he again fell, he finally pulled himself to a stand, and limped around the classroom for more undetermined amounts of time before he was checked on by center staff and then his parent was contacted. The center failed to contact the child protection statewide hotline as of 10/19/17, which was confirmed by interview with S1.

1713-E&F: Supervision Participation: Based on observation: While supervising a group of children, S18 did not devote her time to supervision of the children, meeting the needs of the children, and in participation with the children in their activities. The Specialist observed the 9/29/17, video footage and noticed that S18 was not paying attention to (7) 1 y/o children as they freely played around the room. S18's lack of supervision participation resulted in C1 being able to pull down a hazardously propped table that fell on his right foot and the results of the injury was a fracture.

1103-A,C. Based on record review/interviews, center staff failed to immediately notify emergency personnel of a critical incident involving a child in care. A critical incident occurred at 11:16.00 am on 1/11/2018, involving C1, that required C1 to be transported by ambulance to the hospital. Based on review of center's written policy regarding emergency response, it indicates the center will call 911 for emergency transportation to a hospital, however, S4 and S15 failed to contact 911 emergency services. Based on interview with S4 she stated she ran to the office and told S15 to call 911. Based on interview with S15 and review of NOBTS Campus Police Report, S15 contacted NOBTS Campus Police dispatch first at 11:26 am and informed dispatch to contact 911 emergency personnel. Center staff also failed to notify Child Welfare within 24 hours of the incident involving C1 as interview with S1 reflected no notification to Child Welfare had been made. S1 had not notified Child Welfare as of licensing visit held on 1/22/2018.

S3 stated she saw a group of girls surrounding C1, went over to the group, and noticed C1's head was in the water. When she tapped C1, she didn't respond and she noticed her life jacket was missing. S3 lifted C1 out of the pool and called for help. S3 stated a life guard was first to respond to her call, performed CPR, and C1 was taken to the hospital by EMS. S1 stated C1 was in her group. S1 stated everyone was exiting the pool and she was assisting the children with getting their things and lining up. S1 stated she heard a call for help and then observed C1 on the ground receiving CPR. S1 stated S2 told her that C1 went to the restroom and she assumed that C1 must have taken the life jacket she had on off. S2 stated C1 asked to go to the restroom after the whistle was blown, and she walked into the restroom with C1 but didn't stay and didn't take her life jacket off. S2 stated she didn't see C1 take off her life jacket. S2 stated no one noticed C1 was in the water until she was pulled out.

No one could provide an explanation of how or when C1 entered the pool and how long she was unconscious in the water. On 11/26/18, the center's attendance log failed to be accurate when Specialist reviewed transportation logs and found that C1 was present on the bus that day, however, children daily attendance records do not indicate that C1 was in class.

S23, S24 and S25 stated they have not documented any visual passenger checks since the beginning of the school year.

Based on record review and interview at 9:00 AM, S1 failed to notify Child Welfare within 24 hours of the Critical incident: Specialist reviewed a critical incident report and found on 4/29/2021, at 2:00 PM, S2 lifted C1 inappropriately causing C1's elbow to become dislocated. S1 stated she was unaware that Child Welfare needed to be notified of this incident.

Corrective Action Plan: Effective 5/11/2021, S1 stated she will ensure that she notifies Child Welfare if an incident such as this occurs again to ensure this deficiency is not cited again.

1911.I.&J.: Proper Lifting of a Child

Not Met

1911.I.&J.: Staff members shall adhere to proper techniques for lifting a child.

Staff members shall not lift a child by one or both arms.

Finding:

1911.I&J: Based on observations, interviews, and record review at 9:00 AM, S2 failed to lift a child using proper lifting techniques as she lifted a child using one arm. Specialist reviewed a critical incident report and found on 4/29/2021, at 2:00 PM, S2 lifted C1 inappropriately causing C1's elbow to become dislocated. Specialist viewed center surveillance video and observed S2 seated on the floor with 5 infants playing on the floor as well. C2 began to crawl on C1; so, S2 pulled C1 to her by her right hand. C1 became caught on a toy on the floor; so, S2 lifted C1 up as she pulled C1 to her. C1 immediately began crying and S2 attempted to comfort her.

Corrective Action: Effective 5/11/2021, S1 stated she has retrained S2 on proper lifting and has added this training to her new hire training for future staff to ensure this deficiency is not cited again.
