

Family Literacy Engagement Grab & Go: Food Festival

## Materials:

- Food dishes representing multiple cultures, including those represented by the local community
- Tables
- Books about different cultures
- Volunteers
- Funding, if needed for venue

## Steps:

- 1. Determine a location, date, and time for the event. Consider accommodations for weather.
- 2. Designate leaders for each country and/or culture represented at the festival.
- 3. Recruit volunteers such as family members, community leaders, retired educators, and high school extracurricular club members to assist with hosting the event.
- 4. Utilize the Strategies to Overcome Barriers in the Family Literacy Engagement Strategic Plan to ensure equity.
- 5. Organize tables and set up food items and related books on the tables, manned by volunteers or designated representatives.
- 6. Allow attendees to mingle and enjoy the unique, flavor-rich dishes and stories!
- 7. Have recipes and information to share or engage in conversations about the origin of the dishes and the culture from which they come.

## Lagniappe:

Create and send invitations to community organizations, families, and leaders to encourage community-wide support and participation.

Have participants provide recipes of dishes ahead of time to the event organizer. A cookbook can be created and sold as a school or community fundraiser.
