Activity Title: Gestures

Activity Purpose: Build your child's vocabulary by using words along with the gestures and facial expressions.

The more gestures a child has, the more they will be able to communicate their thoughts and feelings.  - For example, when you child does something you want to praise, clap and describe your action as well as why you're doing it. "Wow, you did a great job. I'm clapping to show you that I'm so excited and happy."
 - Or as you point to something say, "That is_____" or "What is that? It is ______."
