Session Objectives:

By the end of this session, participants will be able to:

- explain how vocabulary is an essential part of reading comprehension
- share ideas for how you can build your students' vocabulary so that they can engage more deeply with complex texts.

 - Engage teachers in a discussion of how vocabulary instruction supports reading comprehension. Ask the teachers to reflect on the Engage question.

 - Engage: How does vocabulary impact comprehension? How will you incorporate vocabulary instruction into your ELA block?
