Student Proficiency



Students demonstrate mastery of nationallycompetitive, grade level content. (Grades 3-12)

Graduation Rate



Students graduate within four years at a rate of 90% or higher.

Pursuit of College & Career



Every graduate has the funding needed to continue their education at the next level.



PERCENT OF STUDENTS SCORING MASTERY AND ABOVE ON LEAP






ACT

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PERFORMANCE ON THE ACT



NUMBER OF STUDENTS EARNING A QUALIFYING SCORE OF 3, 4, OR 5





In 2019, Louisiana had the **highest percentage** of students completing the FAFSA by the July 1, 2019 priority deadline, and showed the greatest growth than any other state in the country.



TOPS

The number of students annually eligible for TOPS scholarships, or full college tuition, has increased by **18%** since 2012.



COLLEGE ENROLLMENT
