WHAT PROJECTS MIGHT AN EARLY CHILDHOOD TEACHER LEADER ADVISOR COMPLETE?

Early Childhood projects could include creating and reviewing content for early childhood providers such as developing:

- assessment support documents and exemplars;
 - resources that align with and facilitate the use of the [Early Learning and Development Standards](#);
 - resources that focus on increasing instructional support and engaged support for learning within early childhood;
 - resources for caregivers that promote at-home learning; and
 - developing and facilitating early childhood professional development sessions at the Teacher Leader Summit, the Early Childhood Conference, and other venues across the state as determined by the LDOE.
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WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Any current early childhood educators and leaders who are passionate about ensuring that high-quality materials are available to Louisiana students, and have the following:

- 3+ years of content experience
- deep understanding of the early learning and development standards
- the capacity to devote time towards additional projects outside the normal work day.

TLAs work 5-10 hours a week, outside of classroom/normal employment time on their assignments. Initial training is required in addition to check-ins with the workgroup manager and other TLAs for feedback on deliverables. For the bulk of the work, TLAs plan their schedule to determine how they will complete the deliverables.

HOW ARE TEACHER LEADER ADVISORS COMPENSATED?

- TLAs are compensated for completed projects.
 - TLAs can be paid a range of \$50 to \$500 per assigned deliverable.
 - Contracts can range from \$1,500 to \$5,000.
