# Figurative Language



A simile is comparing two things using "like" or "as"

Examples: as white as a mimosa blossom  
her eyes rolled around in head like pinballs

simile

A metaphor is comparing two things WITHOUT using "like" or "as"

Example: smarting worse than if he'd fallen headfirst into a nest of fire ants

metaphor



An idiom is a group of words that means something different than the meaning of each word

Example: the apple of my eye

idiom

Alliteration is repeating the same sound at the beginning of each word in a line or sentence.

Example: grassy green grass

alliteration

Onomatopoeia is a sound word.

Examples: sizzle                  buzz  
              rip                        errrk
