ELA	3-12	Using PLCs to Prepare to Effectively Teach Guidebooks 2.0	Leading PLCs is a great way for Teacher Leaders to expand their impact and positively influence the instruction of peers. Researchers have called PLCs "the most powerful professional development and change strategy available" (Huffman & Hipp, 2003), but educators aren't always sure how to make the most of them. This session will set up Teacher Leaders to: • Describe the characteristics of effective PLCs • Practice using PLCs to effectively internalize, prepare to teach, and reflect on Guidebook 2.0 lessons • Create a plan for implementing curriculum-based PLCs in their own schools using lessons learned from other districts' approaches.	
Library, ELA	K-12	This is Not Your Mama's Library!	Does your school have a 21st century library? The focus of school library programs has shifted from an emphasis on resources to an emphasis on creating a community of lifelong learners and creators. In this session, librarians from the Louisiana Association of School Libraries will present the updated library guidelines to support you in developing a course of action to ensure your school library is an effective school library program that positively impacts student learning.

Math	3-12	LDOE Math Tools	Join this session to learn more about the purpose and intended use of each tool on the Math Planning Page on the LDOE website. We will review a number of tools to help math teachers, coaches, and administrators ensure math instruction is focused, rigorous, and coherent.	
Science	3-12	Science Standards - Overview of Drafts and Implementation Plan	In March, the Science Standards Review Committee will submit a draft of the proposed Louisiana Student Standards for Science to BESE for approval. For those eager to dig in early, join this session to learn about the underlying framework of the drafts of the standards and plans for implementation support.	
Social Studies	K-12	Social Studies Shifts	Building on content and claims, participants will explore the three main shifts in social studies instruction: 1. Use sources regularly to learn content 2. Make connections among people, events, and ideas across time and place 3. Express informed opinions supported by evidence from sources and outside knowledge. By reviewing sources in the updated Social Studies Scope and Sequence exemplar, discussing a PLC scenario, and analyzing a class discussion, participants will identify clear next steps in implementing the social studies instructional shifts.
