- Know and be able to identify the components of a unit of study.
- Analyze the culminating writing task and cold read assessment and extension task for what students need to know and be able to do as readers and writers.
- Examine the anchor text and supportive text set.
- Plan lessons with clear learning targets that are Louisiana Standards-based.
- Live as adult readers and writers in order to analyze and transfer the cognitive demand of the lesson.
