This sheet is intended to estimate the projected difference between state funding received in FY15-16 and the estimated allocation amount for FY16-17 for city, parish or other local public school systems or schools. This is a projection only and includes only state MFP funding and does not include federal or local funding. The FY16-17 projection is based on the 2/1/16 student count and FY14-15 tax data. The \$44 million appropriated outside of the FY15-16 formula are folded into the FY16-17 projected formula via a 1.375% increase to the Base Per Pupil Amount and funds added to High Cost Services and Supplemental Course Allocation in Level 4.
