Educator Talent and Workforce Development

The New Teacher Experience - Professional Learning Modules

Please share with school leaders, school system leaders, and new teachers.

The LDOE, in partnership with A+PEL, has developed monthly professional learning modules on topics that are critical for new teacher success. These modules include online asynchronous content followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply these concepts.

Teachers are expected to complete the entire series of Professional Learning Modules. These five modules are designed to build learning throughout the year.

- Module 1: Classroom Management/Classroom Environment
- Module 2: Standards and Curriculum
- Module 3: Data Literacy
- Module 4: Literacy for 21st Century Learners
- Module 5: Parent and Community Engagement

This year, complimentary seating for the first 245 registrants will be offered. Half of the seats for the northern location (Monroe) and half for the southern location (Port Allen) will be reserved as complementary seating. Once those seats are exhausted, teachers may still attend but there will be a cost of \$1,272.00 per teacher to complete the series of modules.

Teachers will be asked to receive approval to attend from their school leader. <u>Registration</u> is now open. Once teachers complete the registration, participants will receive details on selected training locations. Participants will also receive an invitation to access the online asynchronous modules.

Following the sessions on System Coherence, Instructional Coherence, and Leadership Capacity Building, system leadership teams will have an opportunity to huddle for sharing and collaborative planning pertaining to the pathway learning.

2024-2025 Title I, Part A - Annual Comparability Reports

Share with superintendents and federal program directors.

The LDOE will release the 2024-2025 SY Title I Comparability Report section in eGMS on September 16.

Title I Comparability requires school systems* to demonstrate that services provided with state and local funds are comparable between both Title I schools and non-Title I schools, or are substantially comparable for school systems with all Title I schools.

School systems should use October 2023 staffing and salary data to complete this report. Please access the <u>Comparability Instructions</u> for further details on how to complete the report. The completed report should be submitted via eGMS no later than November 15.

*School systems with one school per grade span and Type 2, 3, 3B, and 5 charters are exempt from this submission.

<u>Louisiana Elementary and Secondary Education Act Fiscal Flexibility Waiver Request</u> Please share with federal program directors, business managers, superintendents, and financial officials.

Instructional loss presented unique learning challenges for Louisiana's students, increasing the need to provide continued, evidence-based instructional strategies to support learning loss and provide educators with targeted professional development. LDOE requested the U. S. Department of Education (ED) approve its tydings waiver to receive the opportunity to access additional flexibilities for certain funds received under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). This waiver will support the statewide instructional focus areas, including literacy, STEM, and college and career activities. The state has already witnessed positive gains regarding student learning loss recovery efforts.

In recent communication received from ED, the requested ESEA Waiver has been approved. This waiver includes flexibility for carryover limitations on FY 2023 Title I Part A funds, period of availability of FY 2022 funds for Title I Part A, B, C, and D; Title II Part A, Title III Part A, Title IV Part A and B; and Title V Part B Subpart 2. Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

LEAP 2025 Social Studies Resources

Please share with school and system leaders, testing coordinators, and teachers.

In 2024-2025, the social studies assessments for grades 3-8 and Civics for high school will be administered as an operational assessment that will be included in school performance scores. The "Classroom Assessment Items" have been revised, updated, and renamed and are now available in the <u>Assessment Guidance Library</u> under the Social Studies Assessment Resources heading. Teachers should focus on teaching the curriculum and using the embedded assessments. The "LEAP Practice Questions" contain essentially the same content; the renaming intends to make a clearer distinction between curricular resources and LEAP assessment resources. Revisions and updates include:

- Stylistic changes primarily regarding purpose-setting statements
- Item-specific scoring rubrics for CRs and ERs
- Minor content corrections primarily focused on precision in wording

Innovative Assessment for ELA

The department announced the discontinuance of the Innovative Assessment for ELA at all grade levels. Participating schools and systems have until September 30 to download reports from the ADAM testing and reporting platform before it is permanently closed to Louisiana users. The LDOE will maintain score files but will not have access to PDF score reports after September 30.

<u>Assessment Data Certification</u>

Please share with accountability contact and school leaders.

Assessment data certification opened on August 29 in La Data Review. With the opening, schools received assessment rosters for all schools that included scores from LEAP, LEAP Connect, ELPT, ELPT Connect, and Innovative Assessments for ELA. School systems also received a separate ELPT progress roster that confirms the points awarded to the assessment index included in the SPS. LEAP progress rosters are not yet available, and accountability contacts will be notified when they are posted.

School systems should work through their district accountability contact who has been granted an account in La Data Review. All submissions must be completed and submitted no later than September 25. Data not corrected during the appropriate cleanup period cannot be used to appeal school performance scores once released.

Elementary School Counselor Survey

Per <u>R.S. 17:3005</u>, "School counselors shall provide preventive and developmental counseling services to all public elementary school students in kindergarten through grade six in order to prepare them for middle, junior, and senior high school responsibilities and their social and physical development".

Elementary school counselors and administrators should complete the <u>Elementary School Counselor Report Survey</u> to provide feedback on school counseling programs by October 1.

2024-2025 School Health Survey

Please share with school principals.

As required by state law, the LDOE monitors and evaluates health, recess, physical activity, and employee training in schools to provide an annual report to the Louisiana Legislature. Participation is critical to providing accurate, high-quality data to the Senate and House Committees on Health and Welfare. Also, the LDOE is required to collect information to provide funding to schools for AEDs and CPR/First Aid kits.

Although information may be collected from other staff, please have each principal in each school complete the <u>2024-2025 School Health Survey</u> by October 18.

U.S. Presidential Scholars Program

Please share with system leaders, principals, and teachers.

The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program was established to recognize and honor some of our nation's most distinguished graduating high school students selected on the basis of outstanding scholarship. All high school seniors graduating between January and August 2025, who are U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents and who attend public, parochial, or independent schools, as well as those who are home-schooled, are eligible. School systems can submit, for LDOE consideration, up to two students in the General Component and up to two students in the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Component. The Department can nominate up to 10 males and 10 females AND up to five additional students for the CTE recognition component. This is a recognition program, not a scholarship program. The 2025 U.S. Presidential Scholars will be selected by the Commission on Presidential Scholars and receive the Presidential Scholars Medallion.

In order to recommend students for nomination to the program, school systems are required to submit to the LDOE a parental release form for each nominated student and complete a <u>JotForm application</u> for each student by 4 p.m. November 6. It is recommended that school systems review the LDOE evaluation rubric prior to nominating students.

2025-2026 BESE and Brumfield v Dodd Approval Application

Please share with nonpublic school leaders.

Nonpublic Schools Seeking State Approval must apply annually for approval by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). To become eligible for state and federal funding, schools must be approved by BESE and also comply with Brumfield vs. Dodd, a federal court order that prohibits discrimination.

The <u>2025-2026 BESE Approval Application</u> is now available through October 15. The 2025-2026 Brumfield v Dodd Application is accessible within the BESE application.

2024-2025 Nonpublic School Annual Reporting

Please share with nonpublic school leaders and data managers.

The annual enrollment report window for all nonpublic schools approved by BESE (Private Schools Seeking State Approval) to submit their school's 2024-2025 annual enrollment data opened on August 26 and closes on October 15.

Prior to completing NPS annual enrollment reports, the school administrator who will be entering the accurate data is required to set up an EdLink account and request the "NPS School Manager Role." Please review and follow the request steps in the NPS Edlink Manual for the Annual Enrollment Report PDF.

Quarter 1 Scholarship Enrollment

Please share with nonpublic school leaders and data managers.

Quarter 1 reporting for the Louisiana Scholarship Program (SEE) and School Choice Program (SCS) must be submitted September 3-9 in order to receive tuition payments on time.

- If any information is incorrect or a student is missing from the roster, please contact studentscholarships@la.gov immediately for assistance.
- If the enrollment reports are not accurate and submitted on time, it affects the student enrollment counts and delays tuition payments.
- Each school is responsible for reviewing the final quarterly enrollment report as entered in the LEADS system.
- If a student drops, please follow the drop procedures so that the student can be dropped from the roster.

Schools will have 30 days from the last day of the quarterly enrollment reporting period each quarter to report any enrollment issues.
