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Message from the State Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

Last week, BESE <u>approved our latest step</u> to responsibly reduce the time students and teachers spend on state assessments.

Starting with students entering ninth grade in 2026–2027, high school testing in English language arts and math will move to a comprehensive exam model. This will reduce the number of high school assessments from six to four while maintaining rigor, reliability, and validity.

This change builds on Louisiana's multi-year effort to streamline testing:

- In 2024, we reduced grades 3–8 ELA and math testing time by 20 percent.
- In 2025, we <u>announced a 50 percent reduction in grades 3–8 social studies testing aligned to the Freedom Framework</u>.
- We are now reviewing potential reductions in science for grades 3-8.

This surgical approach reflects what we've heard from the field: we can reduce testing and still uphold high expectations. I'm proud of the work happening across Louisiana to make assessments more meaningful, more efficient, and more supportive of student learning.

Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

ACT - Accommodations Timeline and Reminders

Please share with testing coordinators and school leaders.

September 8-January 28, 2026:

- Request ACT-Authorized Accommodations and/or supports for eligible examinees for Test Window 1 (Initial and Reconsideration) through the <u>Test Accessibility and Accommodations (TAA)</u>.
 - Refer to the <u>TAA User Guide</u> for detailed information and guidance.
 - o For additional guidance, see Requesting Accommodations and English-Learner (EL) Supports.
- For students who were previously authorized for an accommodation, associate selected test date with their TAA request.
- Submit requests as early as possible to allow time for reconsideration, if needed.

Important: ACT cannot guarantee deadline extensions due to unforeseen events (e.g., acts of nature, power or internet outage, or staff changes).

State Testing Accommodations Deadlines

Please share with testing coordinators, IEP teams, and school leaders.

Policy mandates that all accommodations for state testing be in place no later than 30 days prior to the opening of a state testing window. All accommodations that will be provided to students participating in the following assessments must be finalized on IEPs, IAPs, and EL checklists by November 1.

- LEAP Fall High School Test Administration
- K-3 MOY Literacy Screening
- K-3 MOY Numeracy Screening

All students must be identified as eligible for participation in LEAP Connect no later than January 23, 2026.

State Testing Schedules

Louisiana Works IBC Application Process Update

Please share with system leaders and CTE supervisors.

Louisiana Works (formerly the Louisiana Workforce Commission) is introducing a new process for developing Industry-Based Credential Bundles. Under this process, Louisiana Works will draft initial bundle concepts and share them with regional economic development organizations, LCTCS, and LDOE to validate workforce demand and ensure alignment with postsecondary pathways.

After this review, bundle concepts will be confirmed with business, industry associations, and other partners. School systems will not create or submit bundles, but will continue to support this process by recommending employer partners for engagement.

This approach ensures bundles are responsive to employer needs, aligned with labor market demand, and designed to give students a clear path from high school to training, post-secondary, and career opportunities. Louisiana Works and the LDOE are committed to ensuring that Industry-Based Credential Bundles reflect the skills and credentials most valued by employers, while preparing students for success in high-demand, high-wage careers.
