- Anticipate student misconceptions.
- Study how lessons connect within and across units.
- Highlight key tasks, questions, and strategies expected of all learners.

When used in teacher collaboration, the tool builds shared understanding among teachers, leading to more consistent and coherent instruction. Regular lesson preparation will improve pacing, engagement, and outcomes.

- Units moving grade levels:
  - Diary: moving from grade 8 to grade 9
  - A Lesson Before Dying: moving from grade 9 to grade 10
  - The Joy Luck Club: moving from grade 9 to grade 10
- Additional unit development:
  - Development of additional units for grades 8, 9, and 11 is underway. Future communications will include further details.
