Dear Believe and Prepare Community,

As Louisiana continues its efforts to strengthen teacher preparation, the importance of high-quality instructional materials (HQIM) in educator preparation programs (EPPs) cannot be overstated. A recent <u>article</u> from the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET) highlights how embedding HQIM into EPP coursework and field experiences equips aspiring teachers to meet the demands of today's classrooms with confidence, clarity, and content knowledge.

NIET's work in Arkansas has shown that when EPP faculty are trained to model HQIM-aligned practices, aspiring teachers are better prepared to deliver instruction that meets the needs of diverse learners. This approach emphasizes the need for EPPs to "go first" by building internal capacity, aligning training with state standards, and bridging the gap between theory and classroom practice.

In Louisiana, we have taken similar steps to provide access to HQIM and targeted professional learning for preparation providers. However, participation remains low. We encourage EPPs to take full advantage of the year-round support and training offered by the LDOE's academic content team, as well as the modules on the <u>Professional Learning Platform</u>. These opportunities are designed to strengthen instruction, better align programs with K–12 priorities, and ultimately support our shared goal of preparing effective teachers from day one.

Mentor Credential Waiver Portal is OPEN

Since September 2020, every teacher who serves as the mentor of an undergraduate or post-baccalaureate candidate must hold the Mentor Certificate or the Provisional Mentor Ancillary Certificate. Prompted by a shortage of credentialed Mentor Teachers willing to host residents specifically in certain content areas, BESE has allowed a waiver of the Mentor Credential since the 2020-2021 school year.

This application process will be completed by system leads, mentors, principals and in the case of the Alternate Mentor Waiver, education preparation providers.

The portals for <u>Traditional Mentor Waivers</u> and <u>Alternate MentorWaivers</u> opened on August 7, 2025.

Geaux Teach Scholarship Program

Act 463 of the 2022 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature established the Geaux Teach Program, which provides scholarships to students who are enrolled in teacher preparation programs at the state's postsecondary institutions that are approved by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). Funding is also available to students attending certified alternative teacher preparation programs approved by BESE.

Students may receive up to \$5,000 annually to cover the cost of tuition fees, textbooks, and instructional materials required for enrollment. Billing dates for the fall semester/term is November 1, the spring semester/term is May 1, and the summer semester/term is July 1, when applicable.

Fall LAER Recertification

The LAER <u>Annual Recertification</u> window is open in <u>EE PASS</u>. Recertification is required to continue evaluating aspiring educators. Recertification will be available in NIET's <u>FE PASS</u> from **July 7, 2025, until September 18, 2025**.

To complete the recertification assessment:

- Sign in to your **EE PASS** account.
- Refer to the Navigating <u>EE PASS 2.0 Teacher Evaluator Certification Assessment</u> document for guidance on accessing the LAER certification assessment.
- Once you have successfully passed the LAER recertification, download and save your Certificate of Completion for your records.

Specialized Dyslexia Training

A free dyslexia course is available that would fulfill the "specialized training" outlined in <u>Bulletin 996</u> for instructors teaching the dyslexia coursework.

Enrollment in Coursera's <u>Overcoming Dyslexia</u> is currently free and includes nine modules. These modules will focus on advancements in dyslexia research, federal statutes, and pedagogical methods for teaching students with dyslexia.

Preparation providers are highly encouraged to complete the <u>Numeracy Professional Learning courses</u> aligned to <u>Act 260</u> as a guide when enhancing coursework to align with the current <u>Louisiana Mathematics</u> <u>Teacher Competencies</u>. Providers should utilize the <u>information</u> provided to join provider-specific courses in the LDOE professional learning platform, <u>Canopy</u>. <u>Courses</u> specific to teacher candidates are published and may be shared at the provider's discretion.

Educator Background Credentialing

Certification Application System Verifies Fingerprint Clearance Automatically

The Louisiana Educator Certification (LEC) system, accessible through the Louisiana Educator Portal (LEP), launched on July 28, now streamlines the criminal background check (CBC) process for certification applicants. In the past, providers and teacher candidates had to either look up a "Clear Credential" manually on www.teachlouisiana.net or find out a background check was missing only after a certification application was returned unprocessed. Under the new system, that step is automated from the start.

Before an applicant can view or access certification applications, the LEC Portal checks for a valid "Clear Credential" or a CBC on file that is less than five years old. If the applicant has not yet been cleared, the only available option will be the "Fingerprint Clearance Required Before Proceeding" application.

Applicants should select that application type and follow the guided steps, which include:

- Verifying demographic information
- Answering professional conduct questions
- Uploading a valid photo ID and Social Security card
- Downloading the <u>Educator Fingerprinting Packet</u>
- Completing the no-fee application checkout

This process ensures the candidate's information is correctly entered into the Teacher Certification Management System (TCMS). Once the candidate completes their fingerprinting appointment, the Clear Credential will typically be issued within a day or two. At that point, candidates can return to the LEC Portal and access all certification applications available to their account.
