2019 TEACHER LEADER SUMMIT: SAVE THE DATE

The <u>2019 Louisiana Teacher Leader Summit</u> will take place **June 26-28, 2019**, at the New Orleans Ernest N. Morial Convention Center. This event will bring together 5,000 educators from across the state to share their knowledge, learn new skills, and prepare for the 2019–2020 school year.

Multiple sessions will be tailored to educator preparation providers and will cover topics ranging from educator workforce data to the use of high quality curriculum to updates regarding the Teacher Preparation Quality Rating System, to "grow your own" teacher preparation programs that start with dual enrollment credit in high school. In addition, check out the Ed Talks speaker line-up, which includes Dan Goldhaber, an internationally recognized education researcher.

Dr. Goldhaber is the Director of the Center for Analysis of Longitudinal Data in Education Research at the American Institutes for Research and the Director of the Center for Education Data & Research at the University of Washington. His talk will focus on the impact of teacher quality on student outcomes, and how pre-service experiences, mentors in particular, influence teacher development. A private session will be conducted for preparation providers and a school system partner.

MENTOR TEACHER AND CONTENT LEADER NOMINATION PROCESS

The nomination process for 2019-2020 state-provided Mentor Teachers and Content Leaders is currently underway. This will be the final year of state-provided training. The nomination template with separate tabs for both Mentor Teacher and Content Leader nominees is now available.

The nomination template, role-specific nomination <u>guidance</u>, and slide deck from the March 15 webinar are posted in both the <u>Mentor Teacher</u> and <u>Content Leader</u> libraries. School systems and charter schools are responsible for submitting nominees. **Preparation partners should work closely with school system leaders to determine nominees for Mentor Teacher training.**

The deadline to submit the nomination template is April 18.

STATE-APPROVED MENTOR TEACHER AND CONTENT LEADER TRAININGS

In October 2018, <u>BESE approved regulations to establish new state credentials for classroom teachers</u>, who serve as mentors to aspiring teachers and as curriculum experts within their schools. The **Mentor Teacher certificate will be required for teachers who mentor undergraduate or post-baccalaureate residents beginning in September 2020**, eventually replacing the previously required Supervisor of Student Teaching credential.

To transition from state-provided training to state-approved trainings, the Department released two RFAs on January 16, to support new providers' development of these programs. The **Department is excited to announce the following providers have been selected** through the RFA process:

ON-SITE REVIEW WORKGROUP

In May, the Department is reconvening the on-site review workgroup, which will include representation from 15 preparation providers and representatives from the Department, BESE, Board of Regents, school systems, Class Measures, and TPI-US. The Department will use this workgroup's recommendations to revise the on-site review framework that will be used to conduct on-site reviews of teacher preparation programs beginning academic year 2020-2021.

Preparation providers seeking approval to offer new programs that result in initial certification must follow the process outlined below. Preparation providers must first submit a Notice of Intent (NOI), and once that is received, the Department will send a link to the application.
