FINALIZING TEACHER EVALUATIONS FOR 2016-2017

End-of-Year Conversations: Principals and Teachers

End-of-year conversations between principals and teachers should center on these questions:

- What is the attainment level for your student learning targets?
- What changes in practice took place this year based on feedback from observations?
- What opportunities and resources are available as we prepare for next year?

CIS and CVR End-of-Year Timeline: 2016-2017

Compass end-of-year evaluations communicate educator effectiveness as measured by student outcomes and professional practice. The Curriculum Verification and Results (CVR) Reporting Portal provides a method for teachers of certain grades and subjects to verify their rosters to ensure the accurate reporting of transitional student growth data. The following are important activities and dates in regard to the Compass Information System (CIS) and the CVR portal:

- January-May: Teachers, counselors and librarians review observation data and feedback provided in CIS;
- January-August 15: Teachers, counselors and librarians report SLT results, principals rate SLTs;
- April 17-28: CVR roster verification period (view only);
- May 8-19: CVR roster verification period (open correction);
- August 15: Deadline for final evaluation ratings to be entered in CIS.
